COLUMBIA COUNTY, FLORIDA RESOLUTION NUMBER 2009R-02

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF COLUMBIA COUNTY, FLORIDA, SUPPORTING A BILL TO IDENTIFY THE SHERIFF, TAX COLLECTOR, PROPERTY APPRAISER, SUPERVISOR OF ELECTIONS AND CLERK OF THE CIRCUIT COURT AS THE LEGISLATIVE BODY OF THEIR RESPECTIVE EMPLOYEES AND NOT THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Columbia County, Florida, has made the following determinations:

- 1. Several years ago, the Florida Supreme Court reversed long-standing precedent by finding that constitutional office's deputies are entitled to engage in collective bargaining.
- 2. Currently, two Florida Sheriffs (Clay County and Pasco County) have been immediately impacted by the Public Employees Relations Commission (PERC) decision regarding the negotiation's impasse with the Fraternal Order of Police.
- 3. Both suits arise from a situation in which a union has questioned the existing impasse resolution language in F.S. 447.203(10) because it contains a requirement that a "Legislative Body," in these cases, a constitutional officer, have, among other requirements, the authority to appropriate funds.
- 4. The Florida Senate has begun debate on Senate Bill 610 (SB610) to identify the Sheriff, Tax Collector, Property Appraiser, Supervisor of Elections and Clerk of the Circuit Court as the legislative body of their respective employees and NOT the Board of County Commissioners.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Columbia County, Florida:

- <u>SECTION 1:</u> The foregoing recitals contained in the preamble to this Resolution are incorporated by reference herein.
- SECTION 2: This Board supports the adoption of proposed Senate Bill 610 (SB610).
- SECTION 3: The County Manager is hereby directed to send a copy of this Resolution to Governor Charlie Crist, the County's Legislative Delegation and the Executive Director of the Florida Association of Counties.
- SECTION 4: This Resolution shall take effect upon its adoption.

A bill to be entitled

An act relating to collective bargaining for certain public employees; amending s. 447.203, F.S.; specifying that for purposes of resolving an impasse the sheriff, the tax collector, the property appraiser, the supervisor of elections, and the clerk of the circuit court are each deemed the "legislative body" for their respective employees; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Subsection (10) of section 447.203, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

447.203 Definitions.—As used in this part:

(10) "Legislative body" means the State Legislature, the board of county commissioners, the district school board, the governing body of a municipality, or the governing body of an instrumentality or unit of government having authority to appropriate funds and establish policy governing the terms and conditions of employment and which, as the case may be, is the appropriate legislative body for the bargaining unit. For purposes of s. 447.403, the Board of Governors of the State University System, or the board's designee, is shall be deemed to be the legislative body with respect to all employees of each constituent state university. For purposes of s. 447.403 the board of trustees of a community college is shall be deemed to be the legislative body with respect to all employees of the community college. For purposes of s. 447.403, the sheriff, tax

After the pressure washing provided for in Change Order No. 1 and prior to applying the waterproof product, repoint all masonry joints as needed.


