

NACo Prescription Discount Card Program - Revenue Sharing

As you know, Columbia County participates in the National Association of Counties (NACo) prescription discount card program. This program assists county residents who are struggling financially or pay out of pocket for their prescriptions. The card is offered free of charge and provides an average savings of 24% off the full retail cost of prescriptions.

The NACo Board of Directols, at its meeting in December, approved a proposal that will allow counties, state associations and NACo to receive revenue through this program. Counties that choose the revenue option would receive \$1.00 per prescription when the card is used to receive a discount. For NACo and state associations, the payment would be a marketing fee of \$.50. Counties that do not want to receive revenue can continue with the existing program. Residents in counties that elect not to receive revenue would receive a slightly greater discount when purchasing a prescription, approximately 2% - 2.5%.

After reviewing the information provided by NACo, I'm recommending that the Board continue the program as is and decline platticipation in the revenue sharing option. According to the attached spread sheet, Columbia County could receive an estimated annual amount of \$1,926 based on the number of prescriptions filled in a year. However, I believe that the greatest discount should accrue to the residents who use the card as that was the Board's onginal intention when the program was implemented.

The Columbia County Board of County Commissioners met in a regularly scheduled meeting at the School Board Administration Office. The Chair called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. The invocation and Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America followed.

MOTION: By Commissioner Bailey to approve amendments to the agenda. Second by Commissioner DePratter. The motion carried unanimously.

Public Comment:

Citizen Stewart Lilker addressed the need to establish a yearly dollar amount to be set aside for assisting worthwhile organizations.

FFA Week:

The Board heard a presentation by FFA who introduced themselves and requested that the week of February 18-25 be established as FFA Week in Columbia County. The group also

requested permission to have the FFA flag flown at the courthouse that week. Chairwoman Frisina presented the FFA with Proclamation #2012P-1 declaring FFA week February 18-25, 2012.

MOTION: By Commissioner Williams to grant permission to fly the FFA Flag at the Columbia County Courthouse. Second by Commissioner DuPree. The motion carried unanimously.

Utility Committee Recommendations by David Kraus

The Utility Committee submitted the following recommendations for the Board of County Commissioner's consideration:

(1) Adopt a resolution adding the following language to Ordinance No. 2010-11, Section 1.05 - Charges for Service, Section 1.05 - Monthly Water, Sewer and miscellaneous service charges.

On the first month of service for a new customer, the billing charge will be waived and any base facility charge pro-rated over the gallons of usage included in that charge. Any usage in excess of the gallons of usage included in the base facility charge will continue to be charged at the appropriate rate.

Mr. Kraus will provide a formal resolution for approval at a future meeting.

(2) Six customers connected to water and then received a utility bill for \$75.18 after having water service for less than one week. The Utility Committee recommends crediting these six accounts \$24.02 for the base facility charge and \$4.16 for the billing charge. The accounts are:

(3) DEP's Bureau of Water Resource Funding has notified the County that the LP6025 funding is set to expire on March 31, 2012 and that the remaining funds will be withdrawn unless the County applies for and the State approves an extension. This request for additional time has to include a detailed project work plan, the reason for the delay and a requested expiration date. The Columbia County Utility Committee recommends the Board of County Commissioners adopt the work plan for LP6025 and authorize staff to file for an extension on the LP6025 funding.

MOTON: By Commissioner Williams to approve the recommendation. Second by Commissioner Bailey. The motion carried unanimously.

Former Consent Agenda Item #12:

The foregoing resolutions authorize agreements between the Florida Department of Transportation and Columbia County as it relates to the U.S. 90 West Widening Projects. Each of the foregoing resolutions have been reviewed by Contract Engineer John Colson. Mr. Colson only voiced an issue with Resolution No. 2012R-2(c). The D.O.T. is proposing to construct a raised traffic separator in the center of Turner Road between the S&S Food Store and the Columbia County Bank West Branch. From a safety perspective, Mr. Colson does not believe this would be necessary. Supplemental information has been supplied by D.O.T. pertaining to the safety issue.

Resolution No. 2012R-3. Authorizes the chair to execute a perpetual easement at: A portion of S.W. Pinemount Road.

Resolution No. 2012R-4. Authorizes the chair to execute a perpetual easement at the following location: A portion of County Road 252.

Resolution No. 2012R-5. Authorizes the chair to execute a deed transferring the following Parcels to the State of Florida Department of Transportation:

- (a) Portion of N.W. Brown Road (5,648 S.F.)
- (b) Portion of S.W. Sweet Breeze Drive (3,140 s.f.)
- (c) Portion of N.W. Amenity Court (1,785 s.f.)

- (e) Portion of N.W. Turner Avenue (4,843 s.f.)

MOTION: By Commissioner DuPree to approve Resolutions 2012R-3, R-4, and R-5. Second by Commissioner DePratter. The motion carried unanimously.

Resolution No. 2012R-2 authorizes the chair to execute a temporary construction easement at the Following Locations:

- (a) Portion of N.W. Brown Road
- (b) Portion of S.W. Sweet Breeze Drive
- (c) Portion of N.W. Turner Avenue

Chairman DuPree expressed he has an issue with safety, He said that the raised barrier is going to create a bottleneck in traffic and travelers are bound to run into the wall. Additionally, he said the County Engineer is not in favor of this and explained "this" does not meet the Good Samaritan Rule criteria. He concluded by saying that while he is not in agreement with approving this, should the other Board members have a mind to move forward with this, it should be with the understanding that D.O.T. takes ownership of the barrier and that portion of Turner Road.

D.O.T. has indicated that if it is the Board's wishes that they will accept title as was described by Commissioner DuPree for that section of Turner Road, which would contain all of the improvement and include maintenance.

Commissioner Williams said if a decision is made not to erect the barrier that he personally feels the S&S should reimburse D.O.T. the amount of money they were paid for damages.

MOTION: By Commissioner DuPree to have D.O.T. take title to the property all the way through to the end of the concrete barrier and that D.O.T. take responsibility for the maintenance as it relates to 2012R-2.

Clarification was given by County Manager Williams who said that Item (c) under Resolution 2012R-2 would be eliminated, and that particular portion of NW Turner Road that a temporary construction easement was requested for would be added to Resolution 2012R-5, which would transfer ownership to D.O.T.

Commissioner DuPree agreed. Commissioner Williams offered a second.

Attorney Feagle said if this motion passes, he understands that a different resolution will be drafted relating to that portion of Turner Avenue, which the chair will be authorized to sign without bringing it back before the Board. He said that he will speak to the engineer to determine if it will be necessary to retain any type of an easement for utility purposes before conveying.

MOTION: By Commissioner DuPree to approve Section 2 (a) and (b). Second by Commissioner Bailey. The motion carried unanimously.

RING POWER CONTRACTS

County Manager Williams gave a Power Point Presentation (attached) regarding contract with Ring Power. The presentation concluded with staff making the following recommendations:

The total annual maintenance for the 11 (eleven) motor graders is \$80,880. The remaining contractual cost is \$113,455. The estimated "in-house" maintenance cost for the 11 (eleven) motor graders is \$24,200. If requested by the county, Ring Power (maintenance provider) will refund the unused portion of the maintenance contracts. Estimated Saving: \$89,255. Staff recommended approval.

MOTION: By Commissioner Williams to approve. Second by Commissioner Bailey. The motion carried unanimously.

Two (2) motor graders, based on current use, will exceed the 7,500 hours/5years requirement resulting in penalties on the "guaranteed buy back". The penalties would range from \$8,000 - \$10,000 per motor grader. The lease expiration dates are February, 2013 and May, 2013. Ring Power has agreed to early lease termination. Early lease termination will increase the buy-back value. The buy back will increase from \$125,000 per grader to \$140,000 per grader (\$280,000 total). The pay-off for the two graders is \$250,308. The savings is \$29,692. Staff recommended approval.

MOTION: By Commissioner Williams to approve. Second by Commissioner DuPree. The motion carried unanimously.

Of the 11 (eleven) leased motor graders, only 1 (one) is of the steering wheel type and not computerized. This lease will mature June, 2012. This is the only grader that is operable by a wide variety of operators. The purchase price for this unit is \$110,000 (equal to the guaranteed buy back). Staff recommended approval to purchase and keep.

MOTION: By Commissioner Bailey to approve the purchase of the grader with the steering wheel. Second by Commissioner Williams. The motion carried unanimously.

Assuming the Board approves the above recommendations, the county will be 3 (three) motor graders short of the desired fleet. Public Works has offered 2 (two) options (cash and finance) to acquire these units. In lieu of making this decision at this time; it is suggested that the Board authorize bids for 3 (three) motor graders. The bids will be structured to compare a cash price -vs.- a "total cost" price.

MOTION: By Commissioner DuPree to approve. Second by Commissioner Williams. The motion carried unanimously.

The county currently has 3 (three) pieces of equipment (other than motor graders) financed. These pieces include a mixer, bulldozer and loader. The lease is financed at 7% and matures in June, 2012. At maturity, a balloon payment of \$207,198 is required (or accept the guaranteed buy back). Public Works is requesting that the county refinance the balloon and keep the equipment in lieu of replacement. The County Manager requested permission to explore options for refinancing and to do a comparison if purchased on the open market.

MOTION: By Commissioner DuPree that the county "not" attempt to refinance the three pieces of equipment. At its maturity date, the county allow the buyback. Between now and that time staff should place the three pieces of equipment out to bid under the same pretense of the above [last] action. Second by Commissioner Williams. The motion carried unanimously.

Commissioner DuPree directed staff to look into whether the graders have the high interest rates. If so, include them in the bidding process. He also told staff that any savings generated as a result should be placed into Public Works' Equipment Reserve Account.

Columbia County 11-2ESR Comprehensive Plan Amendment (CPA 11-01 and CPA 0205) – Columbia Technology

Objections, Recommendations and Comments have been made by three different state agencies. The County can now withdraw the application/amendment and not proceed, or the County may agree with the comments and recommendations and comply, or the County may take the position that the application is good and will stand on its own merits and therefore address nothing in the ORC Reports.

Staff said the ORC Report has been discussed with the County Planner, County Manager, North Central Florida Regional Planning Council, and Department of Economic Opportunity. Staff said it is believed that the County's application stands on its on merits and that the ORC comments are without merit, unnecessary and very expensive to act upon. Staff recommended the county proceed with the amendment process without making any changes as was requested in the ORC Report.

MOTION: By Commissioner Williams to accept staff recommendation. Second by Commissioner DuPree. The motion carried unanimously.

Waste Pro

As a matter of information, Waste Pro has requested that their Non-Exclusive Franchise Application be pulled and considered at a later date. Staff advised this request will be honored. The Commission discussed the need to establish a cutoff date for companies to make application.

MOTION: By Commissioner DuPree that all vendors currently performing this service must be in compliance with the county's ordinance no later than March 08, 2012. Second by Commissioner Williams. The motion carried unanimously.

Economic Development and Ad Valorem Tax Abatement Projects - Final Closeouts

Mayo Fertilizer - \$21,447

MOTION: By Commissioner Williams to rebate Mayo Fertilizer in accordance with the Job Creation Agreement. Second by Commissioner DuPree. The motion carried unanimously.

Hunter Panels - \$17,343

MOTION: By Commissioner Bailey to determine that Hunter Panels has had an economic downturn that is beyond their control therefore resulting and qualifying for their rebates, which is going to be a total of \$17,343. Second by Commissioner Williams. The motion carried unanimously.

New Millennium

MOTION: By Commissioner DePratter to accept staff's recommendation and not charge New Millennium with penalties. Second by Commissioner Williams. The motion carried unanimously.

Revised Eminent Domain Resolutions Relating to the Lowes and Overflow Land Trust parcels

Attorney Feagle said the resolutions have already been adopted for the two parcels, but the parcels need to be reconfigured by number to match the appraisals that have been ordered and will be needed for clarification purposes during trial.

Overflow Change: This will now be Parcel 1(a)(b).
