

RE: Agenda Item Request Revision of 911 Communications Center Administrative Policy Chapter 2 Staffing

I am requesting Board approval an amendment to the 911 Communications Center Administrative Policy Manual, Chapter 2 regarding PRN employees. It is a cost to the County to maintain PRN Public Safety Telecommunicators certifications and training. In addition, PRN employees should actually work in dispatch periodically to maintain their job skills as PST's. This policy change would require PRN PST employees to work 1 day per month to maintain their PRN status with the County.

I have attached a copy of Chapter 2 of the 911 Communications Center Administrative Policy Manual with the additions underlined and highlighted in red.

In addition, I am requesting a deletion of the word "station" in Section 2 i.

Deletions are noted with strikethrough and highlighted in red.

PRN Employee Training Standards and Work	Requirements11
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1) Hours of Operation:

- a) The Communications Center operates 24 hours per day, 7 days per week. Personnel may be required to work odd hours, holidays, and weekends. Shift work is a condition of employment.
- b) The normal shift hours are as follows:
 Shifts are divided into 12 hour increments with 2 shifts working days and 2 shifts working nights with the following designations:
 - i) Alpha Shift
 - ii) Bravo Shift
 - iii) Charlie Shift
 - iv) Delta Shift

2) Minimum Staffing:

- i) In order to provide station coverage and relief, all squads will operate with no less than five (5) emergency communications personnel. This will provide one (1) member the opportunity for advanced approved leave at any given time.
- ii) **Exception** (4) person minimum, to include the supervisor, is permitted on any actual Columbia County Board of County Commissioners recognized Holiday. The

additional person being off **cannot** require expenditure of additional overtime for shift coverage.

- b) Supervisors may authorize overtime to compensate for vacancies due to the following circumstances:
 - resignation/termination of member(s)
 - new hires in training
 - Sick Leave/Family Medical Leave
 - ➤ Training
 - Jury duty, when such situations would prohibit other shift personnel from utilizing leave.
 - ➢ Bereavement

3) Shift Rotation:

- Shifts will rotate every 2 months.
- Rotation and shift assignment is at the sole discretion of the Communications Center Manager.
- Any accommodation to an employee to remain on a particular shift is at the sole discretion of the Communications Center Manager.

4) Member Leave:

• Will follow the Columbia County Board of County Commissioners Personnel Policy and Procedure.

5) Sick Leave/Family Medical Leave:

- a) Members will use sick leave and family medical leave in accordance with the Board of County Commissioners Policy and Procedure Manual.
- b) Members will speak with the on-duty Assistant Communications Center manager, 9-1-1 Public Safety Telecommunicator Supervisor, or acting-supervisor, thereby establishing an oral communication *and* confirmation of the member's request to utilize sick leave. A leave slip shall be completed indicating a member called in sick. The form will be coded sick leave. The information received by the Assistant Communications Center Manager, shift supervisor, acting-supervisor or other on-duty personnel will be promptly documented *and* communicate to the affected squad supervisor.
- c) Notification, if possible, shall be made two (2) hours prior to shift. This provides time to locate a replacement.
- d) Management may contact the affected member during the course of the sick leave. Members are required to respond to these contacts.
- e) Sick leave longer than three (3) working days may require a legible doctors' note, submitted to member's supervisor, upon return to duty.

6) Unauthorized Absence From Duty:

- a) Personnel absent from duty without authorization may be subject to disciplinary actions.
- b) Three days without notice constitutes abandonment of position as per Columbia County Personnel Policies.

7) Tardiness:

When a member is going to be late for work he/she will call in to report that he/she will be late. Employees should speak directly to the on-duty 9-1-1 Public Safety

Telecommunicator Supervisor. Prior to the end of the shift, tardy employees will submit a memo to their 9-1-1 Public Safety Telecommunicator Supervisor. This memo will indicate the time they reported for duty and the reason they were late.

8) Overtime:

- a) Any full time non-exempt staff member who works in excess of 40 hours per week shall be eligible for overtime compensation.
- b) The shift schedule is placed in the Communications Center approximately two weeks prior to the effective date. The Assistant Communications Center Manager will review the shift schedule and post any known overtime.
- c) Priority for posted overtime for Communications will be given first come first serve basis.
- d) Members who have signed up for overtime accept the responsibility for that vacancy.
- e) If the member who signed up for overtime is unable to fulfill that obligation, it is their responsibility to find a replacement.
- f) 9-1-1 Public Safety Telecommunicator Supervisors are permitted to work overtime.
 - i) 9-1-1 public Safety Telecommunicator Supervisors working on a squad other than their own will answer to that squad's supervisor, regardless of seniority status.
 - ii) In the absence of that squad's supervisor, the 9-1-1 Public Safety Telecommunicator Supervisor working overtime will assume that role for the duration of their stay.
- g) When the vacated position is not filled, which results in staffing under minimum standards, members on duty may be held over to meet operational needs.
- h) When members work overtime, it must be approved by the on-duty 9-1-1 Public Safety Telecommunicator Supervisor.

9) On-Call

PURPOSE: To ensure the availability of personnel for emergency call in to provide adequate shift coverage.

ROCEDURE:

- The Center will establish an on-call list and those employees assigned on-call will be paid at a rate of \$15.00 per twelve (12) hour period of on-call time.
- Employees who are on-call must remain contactable via telephone, are not permitted to consume any alcoholic beverage and be able to respond to the Center in a reasonable amount of time (generally under 1 hour) when on-call.
- 10) Recall to duty and Mandatory Holdover
 - a. All employees shall remain at work until properly relieved of duty.
 - b. All employees, irrespective of rank, shall be required to hold over due to circumstances beyond control of the Center. If needed, mandatory holdover will be executed to ensure that shift coverage and minimum staffing of positions covered appropriately.
 - c. Compensation will begin from the time the employee reports for duty.

- d. Employees recalled to duty shall report within a reasonable period of time after being notified to report to the Center.
- e. Employees shall respond to emergency recall unless incapacitated. Any employee who refuses to respond shall be subject to disciplinary action in accordance with County Personnel Policies and Procedures (10-Added 4/20/2017 BOCC Approved)
- 11. In an effort to increase potential staffing levels and reduce personnel cost, the 911
 - Communications Center encourages the use of PRN employees whenever possible to
 - provide staffing. PRN Public Safety Telecommunicators (PST) must meet all of the
 - training and certification requirements as those required of full-time PST employees.
 - Due to the expense and efforts required to maintain PRN employee's certifications and training requirements, PST PRN employees are required to work one (1) day per month as a PST to remain in active PRN status. Failure to meet these work and training
 - requirements without specific approval of the 911 Communications Center Manager will
 - result in the employee being terminated from PRN status as outlined in the Columbia
 - County Personnel & Procedures Manual.

NOTICE TO APPLICANT

A special family lot permit may be issued by the Board of County Commissioners on land zoned Agricultural or Environmentally Sensitive Area within these Land Development Regulations, for the purpose of conveying a lot or parcel to an immediate family member who is the parent, grandparent, adopted parent, stepparent, sibling, child, or adopted child, stepchild or grandchild of the person who conveyed the parcel to said individual, **not to exceed one (1) dwelling unit per one (1) acre** and the lot complies with all other conditions from permitting development as set forth in these Land Development Regulations. This provision is intended to promote the perpetuation of the family homestead in rural areas by making it possible for immediate family members to reside on lots as their primary residence which exceed maximum density for such areas, provided that the lot complies with the conditions for permitting established in Section 14.9 of the Land Development Regulations.

If approved by the Board of County Commissioner, the division of lots shall be recorded by separate deed, comply with all other applicable regulations of the Land Development Regulations, and comply with all other conditions for permitting and development as set forth in the Land Development Regulations. A completed building permit application shall be submitted within one (1) year of receiving approval by the Board of County Commissioners. One (1) extension can be requested in writing and approved by the Land Development Regulations Administrator not to exceed nine (9) months. If a special family lot permit expires, it shall have to go through the process again for approval as required by this section. A building permit for a special family lot shall be issued only to the immediate family member or their authorized representative (i.e. licensed building contractor or mobile home installer) after a recorded copy of the family relationship residence agreement affidavit and deed to the special family lot has been submitted to the Land Development Regulation Administrator as part of the building permit application process.

Special family lots which have not met the requirements for homestead exemption shall not be transferable except, as follows:

- 1. The deeding of the parcel back to the original owner of the parent tract as indicated in Section 14.9 of the Land Development Regulations;
- 2. To another individual meeting the definition of immediate family member:
- 3. To an individual not meeting the definition of immediate family member due to circumstances beyond the reasonable control of the family member to whom the original special family lot permit was granted such as divorce, death or job change resulting in unreasonable commuting distances, the immediate family member is no longer able to retain ownership of the special family lot, subject to approval by the original reviewing body t hat approved the special family lot permit; and
- 4. Upon approval of the transfer of the special family lot, the County will issue a Certificate of Transfer and the owner shall record the certificate in the Public Records in the Clerk of the Courts Office. This process shall apply retroactively to special family lots previously created under the Land Development Regulations.

Any decision made by the Board of County Commissioners is subject to a 30 day appeal period as outlined in Article 12 of the Land Development Regulations. Any action taken by the applicant within the 30 day appeal period is at the applicant's risk. No Certificate of Occupancy shall be issued until the 30 day appeal period is over or until any appeal has been settled.





MODIFICATION #1 TO SUBGRANT AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE DIVISION OF EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AND THE COLUMBIA COUNTY

This Modification is made and entered into by and between the **State of Florida**, **Division of Emergency Management** ("the Division"), and **Columbia County** ("Recipient"), to modify Contract Number **18-FG-7A-03-22-01-084**, which began on July 1, 2017 ("the Agreement").

WHEREAS, the Division and the Recipient have entered into the Agreement, pursuant to which the Division has provided a subgrant to Recipient under the Emergency Management Preparedness Grant program of **\$52,150.00**;



I would like to change the initial hiring requirements of the Fleet maintenance supervisor for the fire dept. It states that they must have all of their EVT Tech certifications when hired. These certifications are specific to fire apparatus. I am asking that we keep the ASE Certifications as a prerequisite and give them one year to have all of the EVT requirements.

Fleet Maintenance Supervisor Fire Rescue Department

MAJOR FUNCTION:

This is a skilled supervisory and technical position within the Fire Department. An employee assigned to this classification is responsible for diagnosing, repairing, overhauling and maintaining a wide variety of fleet vehicles and equipment; provides complex technical advice and assistance.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:

Examples of duties:

Serves on the fleet leadership team in making business and operational decisions about the management of the fleet.

Supervises and performs repairs to ensure the safe repair and diagnosis of equipment used by the Fire Dept.

Coordinates repair shop activities; seeks most effective methods to have maximum number of vehicles in service at all times; uses fleet management system to generate repair information, making entries for labor charged, commercial shops used and parts inventory movement; processes invoices from vendors and performs computer data entry.

Performs various administrative tasks to facilitate the service function of the department; coordinates parts and supply inventory as needed to ensure equipment repair and maintenance can be performed in a timely manner; special orders parts, hand tools and small equipment; coordinates repair and maintenance activities with various groups involved in the process.

Diagnoses, repairs, and rebuilds components of fire and rescue vehicles and apparatus, automotive, light and heavy trucks, trailers and small engine repair.

Performs preventative maintenance as required on all vehicles and equipment.

Performs field service work as required, utilizing service truck and equipment.

Uses all shop equipment.

Prepares repair schedules and determines priority of work to be performed; maintains service records for all equipment; issues service reminders; develops and schedules preventative maintenance programs.

Monitors and directs the use of proper personal safety gear; ensures a safe work environment including handling of hazardous materials and recycling.



As requested, Darabi and Associates, Inc. (D&A) has prepared this scope of work to prepare an operations permit renewal application package for the Columbia County Winfield Class I and Class III Landfill as required by the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (DEP). The current DEP permit (DEP Permit No.: 9862-015-SC) expires on February 26, 2018. Per Specific Condition 2.A.3 of the existing permit the renewal application is due to the DEP no later than 60 days prior to expiration, which correlates to a due date of December 27, 2017. Due to this requirement it is essential to have the permit renewal application completed immediately. The proposal is discussed in detail below including: scope of services, estimated fee, schedule and assumptions.

SCOPE OF SERVICES

Task 1 - Preparation of Permit Renewal Application

D&A will prepare the permit renewal application package which will include the following elements:

- Form 62-701.900(1) D&A will prepare DEP Form 62-701.900(1). Information required on this form pertains to the facility in general, landfill construction. Operation Plan. Gas Monitoring Plan, Groundwater Monitoring Plan, Financial Assurance and Closure Plan. As required by the Northeast District of the DEP backup data for all sections of the Form will be included in the appendices of the Engineering Report.
- Engincering Report D&A will prepare an engineering report for inclusion in the permit application. The engineering report will be based on information presented in the previous permit application. This document will be revised to address current regulations and any operational changes that may have occurred at the facility since issuance of the current permit.

- Financial Assurance Documentation D&A will prepare the financial assurance cost estimate (long-form) in accordance with 62-701.630. The required backup documentation, including availability of on-site soils will be included as an appendix to the cost estimate.
- Monitoring Plan Evaluation D&A will prepare the technical report required by Rule 62-701.620(6), F.A.C. The report will summarize and interpret the water quality monitoring results and water level measurements collected during the past two and onehalf years. The report will contain the following elements:
 - Tabular displays of any data which shows that a monitoring parameter has been detected, and graphical displays of any leachate indicator parameters detected (such as pH, specific conductance, TDS, TOC, sulfate, chloride, sodium and iron), including hydrographs for all monitoring wells;
 - Trend analyses of any monitoring parameters consistently detected;
 - · Comparisons among shallow, middle, and deep zone wells;
 - Comparison between background water quality and the water quality in detection and compliance wells;
 - Correlations between related parameters such as total dissolved solids and specific conductance:
 - Discussion of erratic and/or poorly correlated data:
 - An interpretation of the groundwater contour maps, including an evaluation of groundwater flow rates; and
 - An evaluation of the adequacy of the water quality monitoring frequency and sampling locations based upon site conditions.
- Operations and Maintenance Plans Revisions -D&A will review the current operations and maintenance plans and update them to be consistent with actual operational procedures.
- Closure and Long-Term Care Plan Revisions The Closure and Long-Term Care Plan will be evaluated and modified, as necessary, to reflect minor changes in closure design, long-term care requirements, and financial responsibility documentation. No significant modifications to the closure design, such as steeper side slopes or vertical expansion, are included in this scope.

Task 2 - Respond to Requests for Additional Information (if necessary)

D&A will prepare response(s) to DEP Request(s) for Additional Information. D&A will meet with DEP staff to discuss the RAI issues prior to submittal of the response(s).

Task 3 - Review Draft Permit

D&A will review the draft DEP permit and prepare a memorandum of proposed revisions if necessary.

EXCLUSIONS AND CONDITIONS:

There is nothing included in this proposal that is not specifically listed herein. No additional services will be initiated without prior approval from the County. The following items are specific exclusions and conditions of this work scope.

- A. The DEP permit renewal application fee will be provided by County.
- B. The County will pay for all advertising fees.
- C. Modifications to the storm water, or environmental resources permit (ERP), including wetlands, will not be required.

Proposed Lump Sum Fee as previously presented and budgeted for 2017-2018 Fiscal year. D&A proposes to complete the scope of work as detailed above for a Lump Sum amount of \$65.000. The scope of this project is to excavate a 987-gallon underground storage tank (approximate size), remove the tank, and then backfill and properly compact the excavation.
