#### Case No. 2017-272 CA – Paynter v Columbia County

County Attorney Forman presented the Board with a settlement agreement between the County and the two plaintiffs, Deric and Kasey Paynter. The settlement amount is \$2,500 to each plaintiff. The settlement sums are within range or less than the costs of defending the claim and the County would be removed as a defendant in this action. Mr. Foreman recommended approval of both agreements.

#### BA 18-31 - Rail Spur Grant Funds

Staff is requesting the Columbia County Board of County Commissioners approve a Budget Amendment that appropriates \$3,135,600 in funds from the Florida Job Growth Grant to extend a rail spur from the CSX railroad to the North Florida Mega Industrial Park along County rail easements.

#### **Discussion and Action Items:**

#### Floodplain Management Regulations – LDR 18-01 and LDR 18-02

In 2014, the American Society of Civil Engineers ("ASCE"), adopted ASCE 24 entitled, "Flood Resistant Design and Construction", it was incorporated into the Florida Building Code ("FBC"). In order to remain compliant with the National Flood Insurance Program ("NFIP"), local governments must adopt floodplain management regulations that are in compliance with NFIP and the FBC.

Staff presented the Board with the draft revisions to Article 8 "Flood Damage Prevention Regulation" of the Land Development Regulations ("LDR") and requested input from the Board.

Discussion ensued.

#### Surplus Property Auctions

Currently the County sells surplus property via the website GovDeals.com. This is an online auction site. GovDeals.com is a "full service" provider. Representatives for the company take photos of all items to sell, post the items and descriptions to the site, administer all bids and payments, and issue bills of sale. Other than providing the items for sale and coordinating inspections for interested bidders, demands on County staff time are minimal. The cost of the GovDeals.com service to the County is zero. All commissions to GovDeals.com are paid through a buyer's premium of 12% of the winning bid price.

The Board expressed concern that a local auctioneer may be able to provide the same or higher level of service than the County currently receives. It is the Board's prerogative to request proposals for auctioneer services. By issuing an RFP the Board can invite providers of auction services to present their capabilities for Board review. Depending on that review the Board may direct staff to work with a new auctioneer.

Staff recommended that any RFP is to benchmark the level of service and cost the County currently has such that new proposals would have to meet or exceed those thresholds.

MOTION by Commissioner Murphy to send out for RFP. SECOND by Commissioner DePratter. The motion carried unanimously.

#### Confidential Information – Resolution No. 2018R-10.

A resolution designating the County Manager and the Economic Development Director as the Official Representatives of Columbia County authorized to receive and distribute confidential information pursuant to Florida Statute 288.075. The resolution calls for use of a form confidentiality agreement.

Discussion ensued.

MOTION by Commissioner Williams to adopt Resolution No. 2018R-10. SECOND by Commissioner Phillips. The motion carried unanimously.

#### **Bascom Norris**

During the construction of the retention pond located on Bascom Norris Drive between Sisters Welcome Road and SR247 that the above mentioned parcel was encroached upon during construction by approximately 4,350 square feet. The current owners are requesting that the County restore the above mentioned property to preexisting conditions prior to construction by placement of approximately 50 dump truck loads of fill dirt, and installation of grass. The Bascom 4 LLC., the current owners of the property have indicated that this will resolve the issue and no further action will be required of the County.

MOTION by Commissioner DePratter to approve. SECOND by Commissioner Williams.

Discussion ensued.

The Chairman called for the vote. The motion carried unanimously.

#### Landscape & Parks Department

Staff is recommending the purchase of a truck for the Landscape and Parks Department outside of the scheduled Five Year Replacement Plan in the amount of \$41,805. This would replace a truck with a blown engine which is too costly to repair.

MOTION by Commissioner Williams to purchase a truck for Landscape and Parks for \$41,805. SECOND by Commissioner Phillips. The motion carried unanimously.

#### Bid No. 2018-D – Annual Fencing Contract

Staff recommends awarding Bid No. 2018-D to the lower bidder, North Florida Fencing Company, Inc., in the amount of \$156,200.

MOTION by Commissioner Williams to approve. SECOND by Commissioner Nash. The motion carried 4 to 0 with Commissioner DePratter abstaining.

#### BA 18-37 Administrative Building Fund to the Jail Building Construction

The Board requested reallocation funds approved for the Administrative Building Construction to the Jail Building Construction. Total funds being \$8,700,000.

911 Communications Center Manager Tom Brazil suggested that the Sheriff fill that position. The 911 Dispatch Workgroup is recommending that the Board of County Commissioners approve this suggestion and transfer the duties and salary of the position to the Columbia County Sheriff's Office.

Discussion ensued.

MOTION by Commissioner Nash to approve budget amendment 18-38, reallocation funding for 911 TAC from the General Fund to the Sheriff Fund. SECOND by Commissioner Phillips. The motion carried unanimously.



# MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

# CAREERSOURCE FLORIDA CROWN

## and

# **BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS – COLUMBIA COUNTY**

### I. Parties to this Agreement:

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is entered into by CareerSource Florida Crown (hereinafter referred to as "CSFC") and Board of County Commissioners – Columbia County (hereinafter referred to as "BOCC").

### II. Purpose of this Agreement:

The purpose of this Agreement is to coordinate resources to ensure the effective and efficient delivery of services during and after declared emergencies. This Agreement also establishes joint processes and procedures that will enable partners to integrate service delivery in a seamless and comprehensive manner to the citizens served by CSFC and the BOCC.

Parties to this Agreement agree to the obligations, performance and accomplishments of the tasks described in Section III. Partners shall coordinate and perform the activities and services described herein within the scope of legislative requirements governing the parties' respective programs, services, and agencies.

#### III. Provisions:

As partners, CSFC and BOCC agree to demonstrate their partnership by the following:

1. In order for the customer to receive seamless services it is imperative that all partners in the system understand each partner's organization, their services and their goals. CSFC will participate in any training and emergency management meetings convened by BOCC emergency management staff. It is understood that all organizations participating need to achieve specific program goals and that supporting each other through training and team work, will result in increased goal achievement by all the partners. It is the intent of CSFC to fully serve and augment the County Emergency Management team to the maximum extent possible.

- 2. Technical questions and customer service issues should be brought to the attention of CSFC and BOCC personnel for quick and efficient resolution.
- IV. Description of Roles and Responsibilities:
  - (a) CSFC will:
  - 1. In the event of a declared emergency, CSFC personnel will report to the Columbia County Emergency Management offices.
  - CSFC staff will meet with all workers displaced by the emergency. Reemployment Assistance/disaster reemployment assistance information will be provided along with assistance on the filing of necessary documentation with appropriate State offices.
  - 3. Those workers who express an interest in returning to immediate employment, will be interviewed for eligibility under National Emergency Grant criteria.
  - 4. Background checks must be done for each worker as part of the eligibility determination process. Additionally, verification must be obtained that the business has, in fact, been damaged, that the worker is displaced, and an estimated date when the worker will be able to return to his/her job.
  - Once eligibility has been established, applicants will be directed to the appropriate County representative to be placed as a temporary hire for the following purposes:
    - A. Clean-up including demolition, cleaning, repair, renovation and reconstruction of damaged and destroyed public and not-for profit structures located within the disaster area;
    - B. Humanitarian assistance including distribution of food, clothing, and other assistance to hurricane victims;
    - C. Collecting data.
  - 6. All jobs falling under this Agreement are temporary jobs for displaced workers, and should be paid the higher of the federal, state or local minimum wage or the prevailing rates of pay for other individuals employed in similar occupations by the same employer. A displaced worker can:
    - A. Work for up to six (6) months from the date of the grant award;
    - B. Earn up to \$12,000 or work for a maximum of 1,040 hours, whichever comes first;

- C. Subject to CSFC's policy limits, transportation assistance and protective clothing (goggles, boots, gloves, helmets) may be allowed support services.
- D. CSFC has the authority to lease equipment for program activities in support of emergency actions identified above.
- (b) BOCC will:
- 1. BOCC will advertise the availability of CSFC services through all appropriate means and direct applicants to designated CSFC personnel.
- 2. BOCC will provide appropriate work space to CSFC personnel and facilitate their enrollment and eligibility determination of applicants.
- BOCC will be responsible for enrolling temporary workers onto their workforce rolls for worker's compensation liability insurance and payroll purposes once eligibility has been determined by CSFC.
- 4. BOCC will submit to CSFC a copy of their payroll/benefit records on a weekly or bi-weekly basis, as appropriate, for reimbursement. Reimbursement will include the actual salary/benefits paid to the displaced worker as well as a ten percent (10%) administrative fee.

#### (c) BOCC will provide the following resources to CSFC:

Work Space Computer/internet connectivity and maintenance Telephone access (log must be kept by CSFC of long distance calls) Copier/Fax systems Security Common areas

#### V. Period of Agreement:

This Agreement shall commence on the date it is executed by both parties and shall terminate on or about June 30, 2019 unless otherwise terminated upon thirty day written notice by either party. Such notice shall be valid only upon delivery by certified mail, return receipt to the other party at their address as included above. Parties may renew this Agreement annually by an updated signatory page for a period of five (5) years.
