Discussion and Action Items:

Interlocal Agreement - Wastewater Collections System

Staff recommended approval of an Interlocal Agreement with the City of Lake City for a Rural Infrastructure Fund Grant to study the City's Wastewater Collection System. The Florida Department of Economic Development has tentatively approved the study contingent upon a Interlocal agreement between the County and the City.

MOTION by Commissioner Witt to approve Interlocal Agreement with the City of Lake City on the study of the City Wastewater Collections System. SECOND by Commissioner Ford. The motion carried unanimously.

Interlocal Agreement – Bell Road Utilities

The County has received notification from the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity of a Rural Infrastructure Fund Grant award in the amount of \$100,000 to complete the design, engineering and permitting of the utilities for the Bell Road Corridor.

Discussion ensued.

MOTION by Commissioner Murphy to approve Interlocal Agreement with the City of Lake City for Bell Road Utilities in the amount of \$100,000. SECOND by Commissioner Ford. The motion carried unanimously.

Resolution No. 2019R-2 – Employee Recognition Program

A resolution establishing an employee recognition awards program to recognize those employees that have demonstrated their commitment to the citizens of Columbia County through their service tenure, exemplary actions over and beyond their normal duties or their substantial contributions to our community.

MOTION by Commissioner Witt to approve Resolution No. 2019R-2. SECOND by Commissioner Murphy. The motion carried unanimously.

BA 19-31 - Bid No. 2018-6 - High Falls Road Bridge

CDM Contracting of Lake Butler was the low bidder at \$328,713.32, however, Curt's Construction formally requested Local Preference under our Purchasing Policy. The request meets the guidelines set forth in the policy therefore; staff recommended awarding the bid to Curt's Construction in the amount of \$333,123.60.

Discussion ensued.

MOTION by Commissioner Witt to approve BA 19-31- Bid NO. 2018-6 High Falls Bridge Replacement in the amount of \$333,123.60 to Curt's Construction. SECOND by Commissioner Murphy. The motion carried unanimously.

Fort White and Heavenly Rest Cemetery

Mayor Frazier from the Town of Fort White is asking the County for assistance in cleaning the Fort White and Heavenly Rest Cemeteries.

Discussion ensued.

MOTION by Commissioner Ford to approve assisting the Town of Fort White by cleaning the cemeteries utilizing County forces with the stipulation that the Town is

responsible for any damage to grave sites. SECOND by Commissioner Nash The motion carried unanimously.

Resolution No. 2019R-5 – Eminent Domain for Bell Road Project

County Attorney Foreman requested authorization to proceed with eminent domain of four (4) parcels on the Bell Road Project; parcels 201, 204, 210 and 211 as described in the resolution.

Discussion ensued.

MOTION by Commissioner Nash to adopt Resolution No. 2019R-5, authorizing eminent domain of parcels 201, 204, 210 and 211 of the Bell Road Project. SECOND by Commissioner Murphy. The motion carried unanimously.

Code Enforcement in Town of Fort White

The Town of Fort White has requested that the County perform code enforcement duties in the Town.

County Attorney Foreman suggested a board be formed to explore the issues associated with the County providing this service.

Discussion ensued.

MOTION by Commissioner Witt to appoint Commissioner Ford to lead a committee to explore the issues associated with providing Code Enforcement for the Town of Fort White and to bring recommendations back to the Board of County Commissioners within sixty days. SECOND by Commissioner Murphy.

Citizen Merrillee Malwitz-Jipson offered comment.

The Chairman called for the vote. The motion carried unanimously.

South Columbia Sports Park

Staff recommended approval of a Memorandum of Understanding between the Columbia County Board of County Commissioners and the Columbia County School Board for the continuing use of the South Columbia Sports Park.

Discussion ensued.

MOTION by Commissioner Ford to adopt the Memorandum of Understanding between the County and the School District for the continuing use of the South Columbia Sports Park. SECOND by Commissioner Murphy. The motion carried unanimously.

BA 19-30 – Equipment Purchases

A budget amendment is required for the 2019 fiscal years equipment purchases in the amount of \$592,810.

MOTION by Commissioner Witt to approve BA 19-30. SECOND by Commissioner Ford. The motion carried unanimously.

Right-Of-Way Acquisition Agent Agreement

CM Scott recommended approval of the Professional Services Agreement with Sandy Kishton.

MOTION by Commissioner Murphy to approve Professional Services Agreement with Sandy Kishton DBA ReMax Professionals to represent Columbia County for right-of-way acquisitions. SECOND by Commissioner Nash. The motion carried unanimously.
