INCIDENT NARRATIVE

RESPONDED TO A STRUCTURE FIRE FROM ELLISVILLE AREA. E-46 AND T-46 ARRIVED ON SCENE FIRST AND ADVISED MOBILE HOME WAS FULLY INVOLVED. THEY PULLED TWO 1 3/4 PRECONNECTS AND STARTED AN INTERIOR ATTACK. BATT 48 ARRIVED ON SCENE ASSUMED COMMAND. CF-10 SPOKE WITH TWO LADIES THAT WAS SITTING ON THE GROUND IN THE FRONT YARD. THEY SAID THEY WERE NOT THE OWNERS AND WERE TRYING TO MAKE CONTACT WITH THE OWNERS. CCSO DEPUTY MAKE CONTACT WITH ME AND SAID HE HAD MADE CONTACT WITH THE HOME OWNER AND HE WAS ON THE WAY.

FIRE WAS KNOCKED DOWN WITH AN EXTENSIVE MOP UP. HOME OWNER ARRIVED. CF-10 SPOKE WITH HIM AND MR CHAPMAN SAID NOTHING WAS LEFT ON INSIDE THE HOUSE. COFFEE POT COMPUTER EVERYTHING WAS OFF. I ASKED IF HE WAS SURE AND HE SAID YES. HE DID SAY THERE WAS TWO DOGS AND TWO CATS INSIDE. ALL ANIMALS WERE FOUND, DECEASED AND REMOVED FROM THE STRUCTURE. PLACED IN THE BACK YARD. HOME OWNER WAS ADVISED OF WHERE THEY WERE.

CF-10 CALLED FOR THE FIRE MARSHAL OFFICE TO CALL HIS CELL PHONE. SFM MADE CONTACT BY PX. SFM DOUGLAS WAS FILLED ON WHAT WE HAD AND HE SAID HE WOULD RESPOND FROM JACKSONVILLE.

MOP UP WAS COMPLETE. UNITS WERE PICKING UP ALL EQUIPMENT. CF-10 WAS GETTING INFO FROM HOME OWNER, WHEN HE TOLD ME THAT HIS WIFE REMEMBER SHE HAD LEFT 3 HEAT LAMPS LIGHTS ON. ON THE BACK PORCH FOR THE CATS AND 1 LIGHT ON THE FRONT PORCH WAS LEFT ON. IT APPEARED THE LIGHTS ON THE BACK PORCH MAY HAVE STARTED THE FIRE AND IT SPREAD THRU THE HOUSE. SFM DOUGLAS ARRIVED ON SCENE. I TOLD HIM WHAT THE OWNER HAD TOLD ME SINCE I TALKED TO SFM. SFM WALKED TO BACK OF HOUSE AND AGREED. IT APPEARED THE LIGHTS MAY HAVE STARTED THE FIRE. BATT 48 CLEARED AND BECAME AVAILABLE. JAT

Unit Narrative

E-46 was dispatched to the stated address, reference a fully involved structure fire. E-46 arrived on scene and found a mobile home, fully involved with 1/4 of the structure, approximately, on the ground PTA. 1206 established command and immediately walked a 360 of the structure, with no obvious hazards noted. Access to shut the power off was unobtainable due to the power pole and electrical panel engulfed in flames. 1206 requested the power company to secure power and a defensive attack was initiated. Both preconnects were stretched, with one line attacking the fire from the front and the other line attacking it from the back. All fire units started arriving on scene and began assisting in suppression efforts. Command was passed to CF-10 and 1206 continued with suppression efforts. As the fire was under control, crews began mopping up hot spots. CF-10 made contact with the homeowner who stated that there was 2 dogs and 2 cats inside the residence. 1206 was notified of this and crews began search for the missing animals. All 4 animals were located, but passed due to the conditions. The pets were wrapped in a sheet and carried away from the structure. Once all hot spots were accounted for and no other hazards were present, scene was left with CF-10, awaiting the fire marshal, and all fire units were released by command. Assignment complete.
