**Questions**

1. Does the type of wood need to be cedar or fir?
  - a. See Question #9
  
2. Is there a certain height?
  - a. Standard Height
  
3. Does the width of it need to be post to post 14' wide or can it just over 14'?
  - a. See Question #9
  
4. Does it need to be all the way on the brick pavers or will it be partially on them and partially on the ground/dirt?
  - a. Pergola will be on both pavers and dirt
  
5. Do we know what kind of base is underneath the brick pavers in the courtyard area?
  - a. No
  
6. Is there any specific stain of brown?
  - a. Brown on Tuscan
  
7. Is there a certain type of lumber that is required for building the pergola? Pressure treated or cedar? Do the posts need to be 4x4's or 6x6's?
  - a. See Question #9
  
8. I am just wanting to confirm that the (3) SW islands that have been planted in lirioppe are the only sections that are being required to dig down 12" and replace with top soil and plant back. If they are all of the section 3 beds are to be done the same way I need to know that detail. Because I was thinking it was only 3 islands that had to be dug down 12".
  - a. All beds with the number 3 will need to be dug 12" down and topsoil replaced and replanted.
  
9. All Specifications for Pergola must follow:

**Tuscan Style Pergola**

12' x 12' (With 1 foot overhanging on each side for a total 14' x 14')

8" x 8" style posts

Lumber needs to be Cedar or North American Douglas Fir
