Fire Assessment Study

Land Development Regulations ("LDR") Amendment

CPA 0225 -To amend Ordinance No.91-6 relating to an amendment to the future land use plan map of the Comprehensive Plan, from residential, very low density to residential, low density for parcel 025973-000. [Ordinance No. 2017-13]

Florida-Friendly use of Fertilizer/Ordinance 2017-09 (adoption hearing)

An ordinance regulating the proper use of fertilizers, requiring proper training and establishing training and licensing requirements. It also establishes application rates and methods, fertilizer free zones; low maintenance zones and provides for exemptions and enforcement.

MOTION by Commissioner Nash to adopt the consent agenda. SECOND by Commissioner Phillips. The motion carried unanimously.

Discussion and Action Items:

Barwick Subdivision/Road Paving

Three bids were received on Bid No. 2017-4, C.A. Boone was the low bidder at \$293,760. Staff recommends approval.

MOTION by Commissioner Depratter to take staff recommendation. SECOND by Commissioner Phillips. The motion carried 4 to 1 with Commissioner Murphy voting in opposition.

Herlong Phase II Road Project

Staff was asked to give the Board an update on the progress of the project since the update on April 22, 2017. The status is unchanged. There are still five parcels that remain in negotiation. Staff is requesting a decision on the alignment of this phase. There are two opinions:

1. The current alignment

- A. Contains two 90 degree turns with stops
- B. Width from CR 131 to first stop to be 24'
- C. After second stop to SE 41 width can be increased from 18' to 22'
- D. Requires acquisition of seven parcels, three of which we have.
- E. Speed limit would have to be decreased
- 2. Proposed Alignment
 - A. Eliminates two 90 degree turns
 - B. Requires additional right-of-way
 - C. Entire road would be widened to 24'
 - D. Phase II would match Phase I

Discussion ensued.

Eminent Domain Resolution/Resolution No. 2017R-15

County Attorney Foreman requested that the Board approve Resolution 2017R-15 giving him the authority to begin eminent domain proceedings for the remaining parcels needed for the project or that they reject the resolution and leave the road alignment as is.

Discussion ensued.

MOTION by Commissioner Phillips to put the two (2) ninety's in the road and not try to acquire additional property. SECOND by Commissioner DePratter. The motion carried 3 to 2 with Commissioners Williams and Murphy voting in opposition.

Medical Marijuana Dispensaries

Staff is requesting direction from the Board regarding the regulation of medical marijuana dispensaries due to the passage of Senate Bill 8-A which provides the Board with the option to ban all such dispensaries within its jurisdiction as opposed to regulating their location.

Discussion ensued.

The following citizens spoke in favor of allowing the dispensaries:

Jimmy Johnson with Weed for Warriors spoke in favor. Four representatives of Save Our Children spoke in opposition to dispensaries in Columbia County. MOTION by Commissioner Murphy directing the County Attorney to prepare amendments to the Land Development Regulations to treat medical marijuana dispensaries as pharmacies as provided under the statute. SECOND by Commissioner Phillips. The motion carried unanimously.

Brown v. Columbia County

Trial counsel in this case has requested a meeting with the Board in a shade meeting to discuss litigation and settlement strategies. Attorney Foreman is requesting approval to set the meeting for August 3, 2017 at 2:00 p.m.

Discussion ensued.

MOTION by Commissioner DePratter to approve setting the shade meeting. SECOND by Commissioner Phillips. The motion carried unanimously.

Resolution No. 2017R-21/County Manager's Authority

Section 3.3(6) of the County Charter provides that the County Manager shall supervise the care and custody of all county property. This resolution is to make clear that the Board understands the scope of the County Manager's authority pursuant to the County Charter.

MOTION by Commissioner DePratter to approve Resolution No. 2017R-21. SECOND by Commissioner Phillips. The motion carried unanimously.

Board Rules and Policies

The County Attorney requested that the resolution to adopt new rules and policies governing the orderly and efficient operation of the Board be tabled until the next meeting.

Discussion ensued.

County Manager's Recommendations (PowerPoint attached):

BA 17-57 – Community Development Block Grant ("CDBG")

The County has been awarded a \$750,000 CDBG Subgrant Agreement with the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity for the Neighborhood Revitalization Project at Plantation Park. It requires an in-kind match of \$50,000 for engineering and labor. Staff recommends approval of the grant agreement.

Discussion ensued.

MOTION by Commissioner Murphy to approve the CDBG sub grant agreement and BA 17-57. SECOND by Commissioner Phillips. The motion carried unanimously.

Preliminary Rate Millage Rate

CM Scott requested permission to set two Public Hearings as required, to set the millage rate. CM Scott would like to schedule the first hearing on September 7, 2017 and the final hearing to adopt the budget at the September 21, 2017 regular scheduled meeting. He also asked that the Board set the preliminary mileage rate.

Discussion ensued.

MOTION by Commissioner Nash to set preliminary millage rate. Set millage and budget public hearing dates. SECOND by Commissioner Murphy.

Amended Motion by Commissioner Nash to set the preliminary millage rate at 8.87. Second by Commissioner Murphy.

The Chairman called for a vote. The motion carried 3 to 2 with Commissioners DePratter and Phillips voting in opposition.

Resolution No. 2017R-24 - Fire Protection Services

This is the preliminary rate resolution for an annual Fire Protection Assessment program in Columbia County for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2017 and which initiates the annual process for updating the Assessment Roll.

Discussion ensued.

MOTION by Commissioner Nash to approve Preliminary Rate Resolution No. 2017R-24 for Fire Protection Services. SECOND by Commissioner Murphy. The motion carried 4 to 1 with Commissioner Williams voting in opposition.

Resolution No. 2017R-25 – Solid Waste Collection

This is the preliminary rate resolution for the collection and disposal of solid waste in Columbia County for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2017 and authorizes the reimposition of annual Service Assessments for Solid Waste Collection and Disposal Services.

MOTION by Commissioner Murphy to approve Preliminary Rate Resolution No. 2017R-25 for Solid Waste and Disposal Services. SECOND by Commissioner Phillips. The motion carried unanimously.

Resolution No. 2017R-26 - Emerald Lake Street Lighting

This resolution is relating to the provision of street lighting services, facilities and programs for Emerald Lakes Street Lighting Municipal Service Benefit Unit and to estimate the cost of street lighting services to be accessed for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2017.

MOTION by Commissioner Nash to approve Preliminary Rate Resolution No. 2017R-26 for Emerald Lake Street Lighting. SECOND by Commissioner Phillips. The motion carried unanimously.

Resolution No. 2017R-27 – Spring Hollow Street Lighting

This resolution is relating to the provision of street lighting services, facilities and programs for Spring Hollow Street Lighting Municipal Service Benefit Unit and to estimate the cost of street lighting services to be accessed for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2017.

MOTION by Commissioner Nash to approve Preliminary Rate Resolution No. 2017R-27for Spring Hollow Lighting. SECOND by Commissioner Phillips. The motion carried unanimously.

Resolution No. 2017R-28 - Carolyn Heights Street Lighting

This resolution is relating to the provision of street lighting services, facilities and programs for Carolyn Heights Street Lighting Municipal Service Benefit Unit ("MSBU") and to estimate the cost of street lighting services to be accessed for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2017.

MOTION by Commissioner DePratter to approve Preliminary Rate Resolution No. 2017R-28 for Carolyn Heights Street Lighting MSBU Initial Assessment. SECOND by Commissioner Murphy. The motion carried unanimously.

Resolution No. 2017R-29 - Pine Ridge Court

This resolution is to establish the estimated assessed cost for the properties that benefit from the Pine Ridge Road Improvement Project thereby directing the preparation of the updated assessment rolls to collect this cost for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2017.

MOTION by Commissioner DePratter to approve Preliminary Rate Resolution No. 2017R-29 for Pine Ridge Court MSBU Local Improvement and Maintenance Assessment. SECOND by Commissioner Phillips. The motion carried unanimously.

Open Public Comments:

Citizen Barbara Lemley offered comment on the Lake Shore Hospital Authority. Commissioner Williams responded. Citizen Merrillee Malwitz-Jipson requested public restrooms at all public access facilities.

Commissioner Comments:

Commissioner Murphy offered comment on the millage rate.

Commissioner DePratter asked that the cost to place porta potties at the Highway 27 Bridge and Hollingsworth Bluff be explored.
