WITH 4x2 MEMBERS

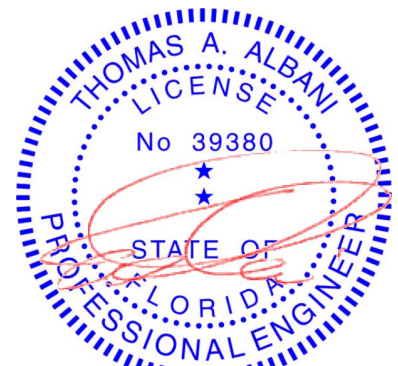

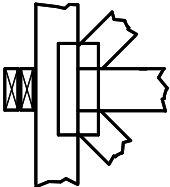
