Where I have continued to work on the project, getting what I can get done, I have been having difficulty with some of the sub-contracting work. Aside from building supply's not available in certain circumstances and prices going through the roof, the main consensus from people I have been talking to are the same issues as many other businesses; understaffed and the demand for services not subsiding any, with people being out due to health, sickness, or an abundance of precautions.

Case in point, trying to get an electrician. I am currently on my 4<sup>th</sup> electrician. My original electrician who did my temp pole and 1<sup>st</sup> rough-in was seemingly ready to get going with running the wires, but wanted to come and look at everything and work up a new estimate for me. After stringing me along for a couple of weeks he backed out on me because he was too busy trying to finish jobs he was already behind on. It's been about the same with the next couple of electricians all of which I was referred to. Each one has cost me about 4 weeks on average, just trying to get them to come out, look the project over, and put an estimate together. I now have someone lined up, but they won't be able to get started on my project for a few more weeks.

I know I need to keep my inspections regular to keep my permit from expiring, but these have been unprecedented irregular times the past 18 months and it affects us all in one way or another, my plight has not been nearly as bad as what others are and have gone through, but it has taken its toll on things, namely my construction project.
