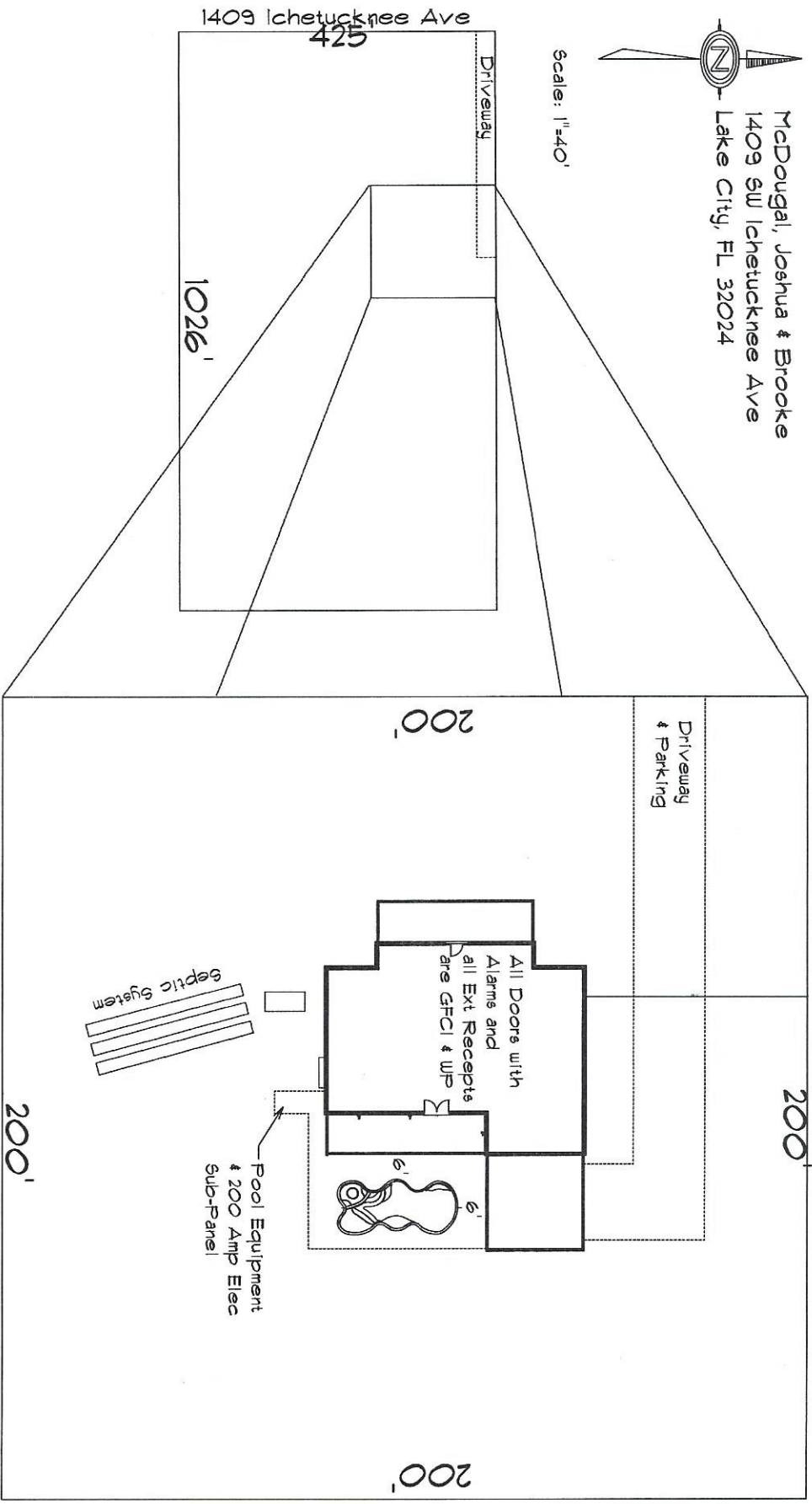

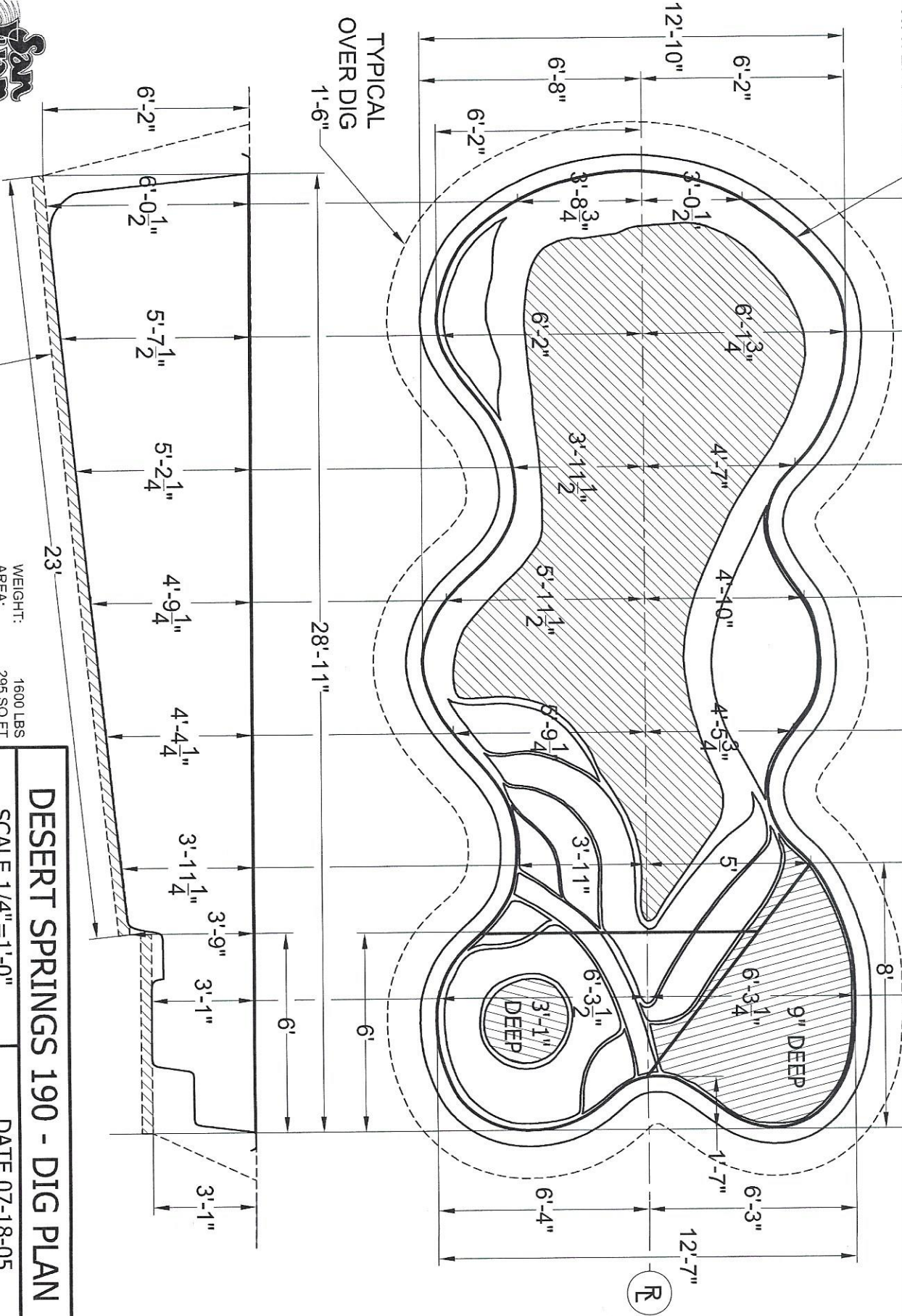

DESERT SPRINGS 190 - DIG PLAN

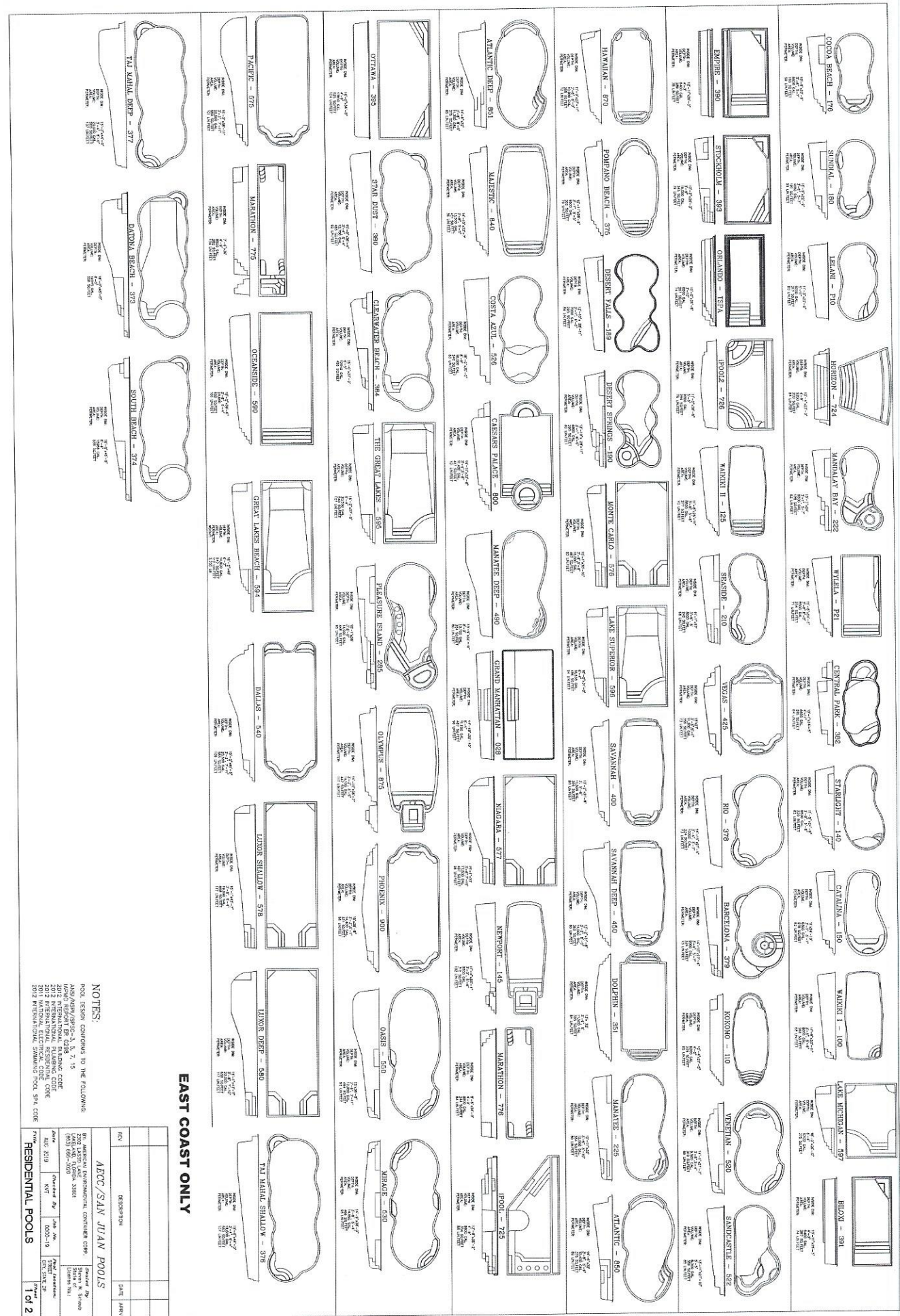

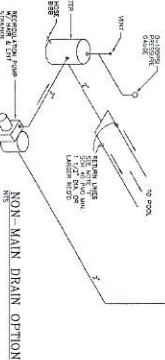
ALTERNATE COPING DETAIL

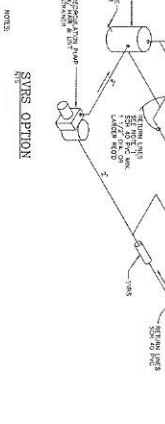
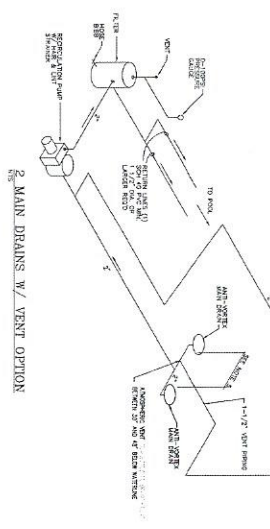
ELECTRICAL DIAGRAM



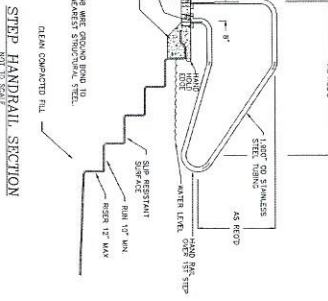

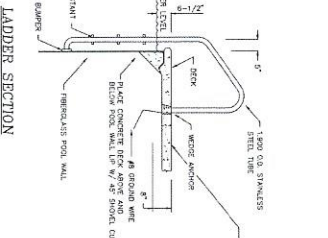

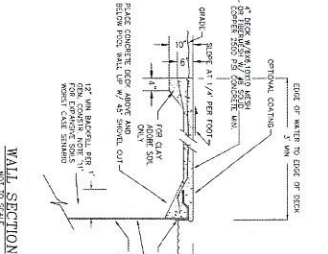
STEP HANDRAIL SECTION
