Building and Zoning Public Hearings:

Land Development Regulations ("LDR") Amendments

CPA 20 02-To amend the text of the Future Land Use Plan Map of the Comprehensive Plan by amending the mixed use district to missed use district – intermodal and to increase the maximum residential density. [Ordinance No. 2020-19]

The public hearing opened and close without comment.

MOTION by Commissioner Williams to approve Ordinance No. 2020-19. SECOND by Commissioner Murphy. The motion carried unanimously.

Resolution No. 2020R – 29 – Spring Hollow Street Lighting Services Assessment

A Resolution re-imposing Spring Hollow Street Lighting Services Assessments against assessable property within the Columbia County Municipal Services Benefit Unit for the Fiscal Year beginning October 1, 2020. There were no rate changes.

The public hearing opened and closed without comment.

MOTION by Commissioner Williams to adopt Final Rate Resolution No. 2020R-29. SECOND by Commissioner Nash. The motion carried unanimously.

Resolution No. 2020R - 30 - Solid Waste Service Assessment

A Resolution re-imposing Solid Waste Assessments against assessable property within the Columbia County Municipal Services Benefit Unit for the Fiscal Year beginning October 1, 2020.

The public hearing opened and closed without comment.

MOTION by Commissioner Nash to adopt Final Rate Resolution No. 2020R-30. SECOND by Commissioner Ford. The motion carried unanimously.

Resolution No. 2020R - 31 - Pine Ridge Court Road Improvement Project

A Resolution re-imposing Pine Ridge Court Maintenance Services and Road Improvement Project Assessments against assessable property, pursuant to the Uniform Assessment Collection Act, for the Fiscal Year beginning October 1, 2020. There are no rate changes.

The public hearing opened and closed without comment.

MOTION by Commissioner Ford to adopt Final Rate Resolution No. 2020R-31. SECOND by Commissioner Williams. The motion carried unanimously.

Resolution No. 2020R - 32 - Fire Protection Services Assessment

A Resolution re-imposing Fire Protection Assessments against assessable property within the Columbia County Municipal Services Benefit Unit for the Fiscal Year beginning October 1, 2020. There were no rate changes.

The public hearing opened and closed without comment.

MOTION by Commissioner Murphy to adopt Resolution No. 2020R-32. SECOND by Commissioner Nash. The motion carried by a vote of 4 to 1 with Commissioner Williams voting in opposition.

Resolution No. 2020R - 33 - Emerald Lakes Street Lighting Services Assessment

A Resolution re-imposing Emerald Lakes Street Lighting Services Assessments against assessable property, pursuant to the Uniform Assessment Collection Act, for the Fiscal Year beginning October 1, 2020. There were no rate changes.

The public hearing opened and closed without comment.

MOTION by Commissioner Nash to adopt Final Rate Resolution No. 2020R-33. SECOND by Commissioner Ford. The motion carried unanimously.

Resolution No. 2020R - 34 - Carolyn Heights Street Lighting Services Assessment

A Resolution re-imposing Carolyn Heights Street Lighting Services Assessments against assessable property within the Columbia County Municipal Services Benefit Unit for the Fiscal Year beginning October 1, 2020. There were no rate changes.

The public hearing opened and closed without comment.

MOTION by Commissioner Williams to adopt Final Rate Resolution No. 2020R-34. SECOND by Commissioner Nash. The motion carried unanimously.

First Budget Hearings:

Millage Rate for Fiscal Year 2020-2021 - First Hearing

The first hearing was held to adopt the millage rate for the 2020-2021 Fiscal Year.

The public hearing opened.

Citizen Stewart Lilker offered comment.

The public hearing closed.

MOTION by Commissioner Nash to adopt and set a tentative millage rate at 8.015 mills for the 2020-2021 fiscal year, which is 2.87% higher than the rolled-back rate of 7.915 mills. SECOND by Commissioner Ford. The motion carried unanimously.

2020-2021 Fiscal Year Budget - First Hearing

CM Scott presented the tentative budget for the 2020-2021 Fiscal Year.

The public hearing opened.

Citizen Stewart Lilker offered comment.

The public hearing closed.

MOTION by Commissioner Murphy to adopt a tentative budget for the fiscal year 2020-2021, appropriations and reserves at \$135,997,541. SECOND by Commissioner Nash. The motion carried unanimously.

Discussion and Action Items:

Annexation

The City of Lake City requested allowing the annexing of the County owned Industrial Park on SR 100. This property is adjacent to the airport and would allow the City to annex the City owned airport property.

MOTION by Commissioner Williams to approve. SECOND by Commissioner Nash. The motion carried unanimously.

Water/Wastewater Service Delivery Structure

Staff recommended contracting with a consultant to review water/wastewater service delivery structure and make a recommendation for the most cost-effective delivery to be consistent with anticipated County growth and economic development strategies.

CM Scott presented the proposed Scope of Work and a proposed fee schedule.

Citizen Stewart Lilker offered comment.

MOTION by Commissioner Ford to approve the proposed Scope of Work and fee schedule in the amount of \$15,000. SECOND by Commissioner Nash. The motion carried unanimously.

SW Huntington Glen

SW Huntington Glen has reached a condition of concern for safety. Staff recommended this road be resurfaced at an estimated cost of \$118,654.

Citizen Stewart Lilker offered comment.

MOTION by Commissioner Nash to approve the resurfacing of SW Huntington Glen in the amount of \$118,654. SECOND by Commissioner Murphy. The motion carried unanimously.

Inmate Mowing – Alternative Options

The Florida Department of Corrections has terminated inmate work crews due to COVID-19. Staff estimated the cost if the County bids out the work.

The amounts below are based on the current Florida Department of Transportation contracts:

Landfill Fees

Staff recommended charging by the cubic yard in order to be more competitive with surrounding facilities. The change should generate business.

MOTION by Commissioner Williams to direct staff to prepare a new landfill rate resolution moving from price per ton to price per cubic yard. SECOND by Commissioner Nash. The motion carried by a vote of 4 to 0 with Commissioner Ford abstaining.

Olustee Park

The City of Lake City and Columbia County have operated for decades as if the City owned Olustee Park, no such ownership record has been located.

In order to clear any question of ownership the City has requested that the County issue a Quit Claim Deed to the City of Lake City transferring ownership.

Subdivision Improvement Maintenance

Staff requested direction for the maintenance of retention ponds, drainage easements, and roads in platted subdivisions.

Discussion ensued.

Cedar Springs Shores

Staff recommended that the Board deed ownership of the lands listed as parks on the subdivision plat to each of the parcels that make up Cedar Springs Shores subdivision.

MOTION by Commissioner Ford to authorize the County Attorney to prepare quitclaim deed to convey all parcels within Cedar Springs Shores subdivision and identified by the Property Appraiser as belonging to Columbia County to all other parcels within Cedar Springs Shores subdivision. SECOND by Commissioner Murphy. The motion carried unanimously.
