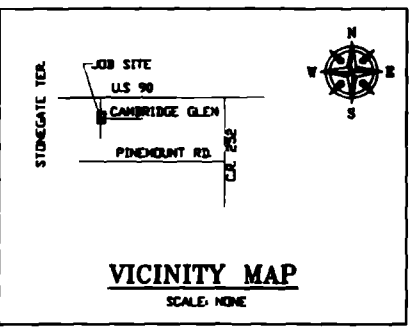

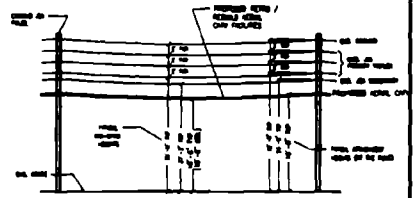

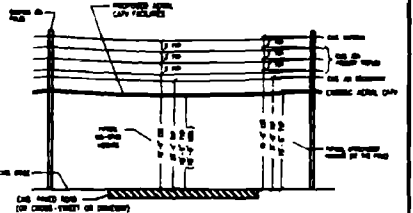
STONEGATE TERR. PLAN VIEW

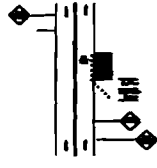

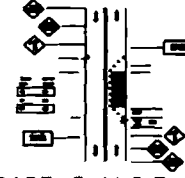

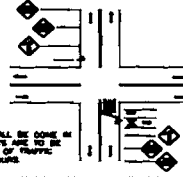

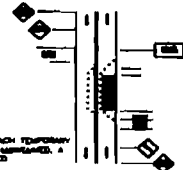
Lane Closure in Advance of an Intersection

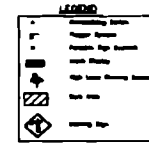

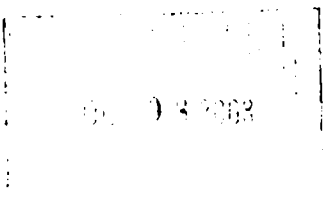

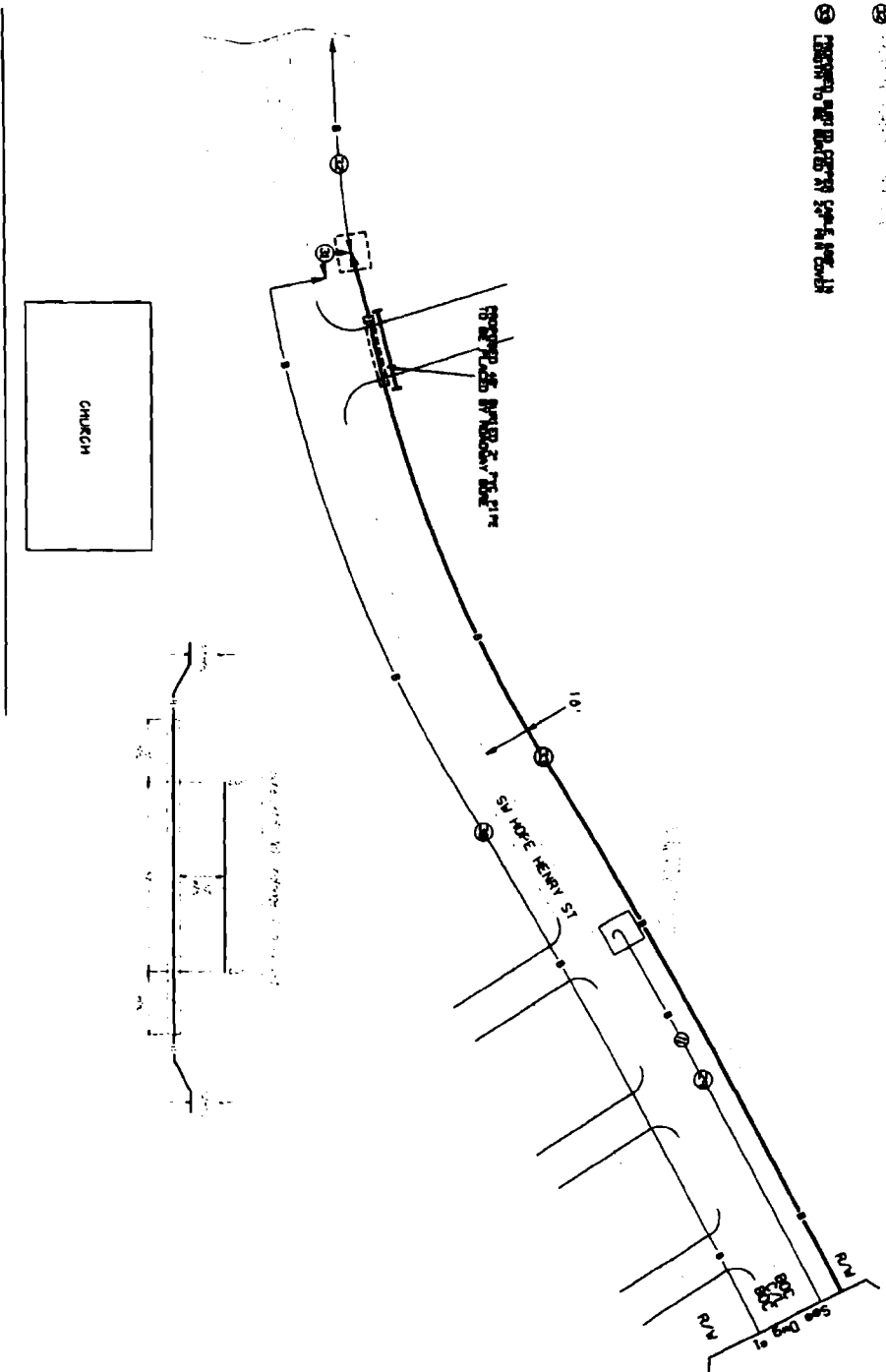

MOTION by Commissioner Bailey to approve with the understanding that there will be two entrance points. Second by Commissioner Skinner. The motion carried unanimously.

Flood Hazard Boundary Maps of Columbia County

The County Manager briefly discussed Columbia County's efforts in cooperation with the Federal Emergency Management Agency and the Suwannee River Water Management District to update the Flood Hazard Boundary Maps of Columbia County.

December 14, 2006 the county received the proposed base flood elevations from FEMA. After which, the county notified all affected property owners, and maps were made available for public inspection. From that point, citizens were provided with an opportunity to meet with county staff and representatives from the Suwannee River Water Management District to discuss the implications. At the conclusion of those meetings FEMA made all changes that they deemed would be appropriate. On June 03, 2008 FEMA met with the public to explain their final determinations. If there are members of the public who did not receive a determination, or who has further questions, they should contact Kevin Wright at the Suwannee River Water Management District office.

On August 12, 2008, the county received the final of FEMA's Flood Hazard Boundary Maps and flood elevations, which will need to be adopted within a 6 month period. Approval will also be needed for the Flood Damage Prevention Ordinance. The ordinance will need to be reviewed by the Planning and Zoning Board prior to the Board's final adoption. This issue will likely be an agenda item on December 30, 2008 Board meeting. The proposed ordinance was prepared by the state. The County Manager asked that any questions or concerns be relayed to him.

Motion by Commissioner Williams to set public hearing for December 30, 2008.
Second by Commissioner Bailey. The motion carried unanimously.

Public Input

Citizen Barbara Lemley expressed concerns and gave reasons why the 911 Center should have a hired executive director with proper credentials to oversee the Center. The Chair responded that there has never been any intentions to not have an executive director. Commissioner Williams added the county is going to hire the best executive director that can be found in the United States of America.

Citizen Rita Hedrick asked where she could review a legible copy of the Flood Damage Prevention Ordinance. The County Manager replied there should be one on the agenda for the current meeting.

Citizen Stewart Lilker recalled in last night's joint City/County meeting that the proposed 911 Interlocal Agreement was based on and is very similar to that of Alachua County. Mr. Lilker recalled that County Manager Williams stated in the joint meeting that Columbia County's version of the interlocal was done by committee. Mr. Lilker asked who served on the committee and when they met. The County Manager responded that there was no actual committee meeting where everyone came together for discussion in one

location. County Manager Williams, Attorney Marlin Feagle, EMS Director Rusty Noah, I.T. Director Todd Manning, and Fire Chief Trey Atkinson added to the proposed interlocal.

At the City/County Meeting on 10/1/08 Chairman Weaver reviewed a time line stating that the Board of County Commissioners, through verbal agreement, transferred the responsibility for providing 9-1-1 services and dispatching Emergency Medical Services to the Columbia County Sheriff on September 30, 2005. Mr. Lilker said September 30, 2008 was on a Friday, and that that according to the Board's minutes, the date the agreement was established between the Board and the Sheriff by motion was on June 05 [no year provided]. He asked that the date on the timeline be corrected by the Board. Mr. Lilker's opinion is that everyone is responsible for the problems that occur at the 911 Dispatch Center. Mr. Lilker said that while he and the Sheriff do not always agree, that he takes exception to the Sheriff being publicly humiliated a few weeks before an election in a political show involving a tape recording.

Mr. Lilker asked for a copy of the letter that the County Manager was directed to send to Windstream regarding long distance rates for residents living in the southern end of the county. The County Manager has not sent the letter but will soon. The toll free numbers for the county offices have been posted to the website. Consideration will be given to elaborating on the telephone numbers.

Mr. Lilker requested the written estimates for the repairs needed on the low boy trailer recently declared surplus. Mr. Lilker said the cost analysis by the Public Works Department was that the repair to the trailer would cost approximately \$26,000. Mr. Lilker said the trailer recently sold for \$6,000, and that an equal replacement would cost approximately \$60,000. Mr. Lilker said it is his understanding that the newly purchased lowboy was not of the same quality and that there was nothing wrong with the trailer that was declared surplus. When Mr. Lilker was asked by the Chairman who his understanding came through, Mr. Lilker offered no names, but replied that it was not an expert off of the street nor was it Commissioner Skinner. The County Manager did not have information pertaining to the repair readily available. Mr. Lilker will check back.

Citizen L.J. Johnson suggested that the FEMA Flood Elevation Maps be made public and placed in the public library. The maps will definitely be made a part of the county web site and information may also be obtained through the Building and Zoning Department Monday through Friday. Consideration will be given to posting the maps at the public library

Mr. Johnson has a need to utilize the law library and questioned when it would be set up and ready for public use. Mr. Johnson learned that it is the court that is responsible for the Law Library, and that the Board of County Commissioners has met their obligations regarding the law library. The County Manager will attempt to get a status for Mr. Johnson.

Mr. Johnson suggested that the drafting table and computers declared junk property (item #14) from the Property Appraisers Office should have been donated to one of the local schools. I.T. Director Todd Manning explained that the computers were truly "junk " and that it is almost impossible to find parts for the surplus computers.

Citizen Laura Bradford asked if the county would add a link to the county's website to the county ordinances. Citizen Stewart Lilker explained to Ms. Bradford where he has

found "the link" in the past. She said that she is computer savvy but was unable to locate it. She asked that it be placed in a more obvious area.

ADJOURNMENT

There being no further business to come before the Board, the meeting adjourned at 7:50 p.m.
