# Board of County Commissioners Minutes of September 07, 2004

The Board of County Commissioners met in the first **BUDGET HEARING** at the School Board Administration Office at 7:00 p.m. The meeting opened with prayer. The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America followed.

# **Public Hearing:**

County Manager Dale Williams gave an overview of the budget using an overhead projector.

The Chair opened the public hearing and announced the proposed millage rate of 8.726 mills is 3.93% greater than the rolled back rate.

The man opened the public hearing.

Citizens H.L. Sistrunk and David Rountree asked questions and offered input. The County Manager gave answers.

Commissioner Montgomery asked what, if anything, the County proposed to do regarding the City's request for additional funds to support fire and recreation. The County Manager answered that at this point, if the Board elects to increase the budget in any area, they will have to decrease the budget in another area.

The public hearing for the **general fund** closed.

MOTION by Commissioner Montgomery to set the millage rate at 8.726 mills. Second by Commissioner Williams. The motion carried unanimously.

MOTION by Commissioner Montgomery to adopt the budget at \$28,698,933. Second by Commissioner Weaver. The motion carried unanimously.

The public hearing opened for the **IDA** (Dependent District).

The Chair announced that the proposed .138 mills is 3.93% over the roll back rate.

Commissioner Williams said that the Board needs to find a way to put more money into this budget. He suggested setting aside the once cent sales tax money for this budget.

MOTION by Commissioner Montgomery to set the millage rate at .138 mills. Second by Commissioner Flinn. The motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Commissioner Montgomery to adopt the budget at \$301,267. Second by Commissioner Weaver. The motion carried unanimously.

Commissioner Montgomery read that the following funds do not levy ad valorem taxes:
