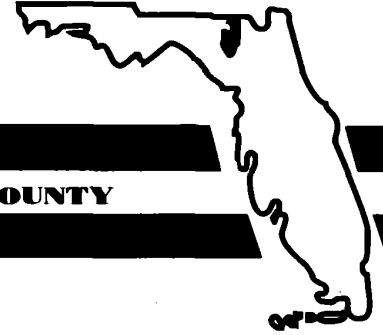

RESOLUTION NO. 2011R-6

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF COLUMBIA COUNTY, FLORIDA CONCERNING AN APPLICATION FOR A SPECIAL PERMIT FOR TEMPORARY USE AS AUTHORIZED UNDER SECTION 14.10 OF ORDINANCE 98-1, AS AMENDED, ENTITLED COLUMBIA COUNTY LAND DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS; APPROVING A SPECIAL PERMIT FOR TEMPORARY USE OF AN ASPHALT BATCH PLANT ON CERTAIN LANDS WITHIN THE UNINCORPORATED AREA OF COLUMBIA COUNTY, FLORIDA; REPEALING RESOLUTIONS IN CONFLICT; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, Ordinance 98-1, as amended, entitled Columbia County Land Development Regulations, hereinafter referred to as the Land Development Regulations, empowers the Board of County Commissioners of Columbia County, Florida, hereinafter referred to as the Board of County Commissioners, to approve, approve with conditions or deny special permits for temporary use as authorized under Section 14.10 of the County's Land Development Regulations;

WHEREAS, an application, SPTU 11-01, for a special permit for temporary use for an asphalt batch plant, as described below, has been filed with the County;

WHEREAS, pursuant to the County's Land Development Regulations, the Planning and Zoning Board of Columbia County, Florida, hereinafter referred to as the Planning and Zoning Board, held the required meeting as part of a previously prepared agenda, on said application, as described below, for a special permit for temporary use for an asphalt batch plant and considered all comments received during said meeting and the Concurrency Management Analysis Report concerning said application, as described below, for a special permit for temporary use for an asphalt batch plant and recommended to the Board of County Commissioners approval of said application, as described below.

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners, held the required public hearing, with due public notice having been provided, on said application, as described below, for a special permit for temporary use for an asphalt batch plant and considered the recommendation of the Planning and Zoning Board, all comments received during said public hearing and the Concurrency Management Analysis Report concerning said Application, as described below.

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners, has found that they are empowered under Section 14.10 of the County's Land Development Regulations to approve, approve with conditions or deny a special permit for temporary use.

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners has determined and found that the application for a special permit for temporary use for an asphalt batch plant on the property described below is in compliance with the provisions of Section 14.10 of the County's Land Development Regulations.

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners has determined and found that:

- (a) Any nuisance or hazardous feature involved is suitably separate from adjacent uses.
- (b) Excessive vehicular traffic will not be generated on minor residential streets.
- (c) A vehicular parking problem will not be created.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF COLUMBIA COUNTY, FLORIDA, THAT:

Section 1. Pursuant to an application, SPTU 11-01, a petition by Anderson Columbia Co., Inc., to request a special permit for temporary use for an asphalt batch plant in an AGRICULTURAL-3 (A-3) zoning district to be located on property described, as follows:

A parcel of land lying within Section 27, Township 5 South, Range 17 East, Columbia County, Florida. Being more particularly described, as follows: Commence at the Northwest corner of the Southeast 1/4 of the Southwest 1/4 of said Section 27, said corner being the Point of Beginning; thence South 89°19'17" East along the North line of said Southeast 1/4 of the Southwest 1/4 of Section 27 a distance of 774.36 feet; thence South 00°40'29" West 495.44 feet to a point on a curve; thence Southwesterly on the curve to the left having a radius of 183.75 feet and an included angle of 17°41'26" for an arc distance of 56.74 feet; thence South 55°14'11" West 96.43 feet to the point of curvature of a curve to the right having a radius of 172.40 feet and an included angle of 47°56'47"; thence Southwesterly along said curve an arc distance of 144.27 feet; thence North 76°49'02" West 93.65 feet; thence South 00°40'29" West 441.01 feet; thence North 89°19'17" West 1,321.85 feet to the Easterly right-of-way line of U.S. Interstate 75 (State Road 93); thence North 17°19'18" West along said Easterly right-of-way line of U.S. Interstate 75 (State Road 93) a distance of 1,046.47 feet to the North line of the Southwest 1/4 of the Southwest 1/4 of said Section 27; thence South 89°19'17" East along said North line of the Southwest 1/4 of the Southwest 1/4 of Section 27 a distance of 1,228.62 feet to the Point of Beginning.

Containing 37.52 acres, more or less.

The Board of County Commissioners conditionally approves a special permit for temporary use for an asphalt batch plant for the above said property subject to the conditions hereinafter specified for a period of three years from the effective date of this resolution.

Section 2. A site plan, submitted as part of the application, dated January 14, 2011 and made part of the resolution by reference, shall govern the development and use of the above described property. Any substantial deviation from the site plan shall be deemed a violation of the County's Land Development Regulations. In addition, any activities to be conducted within the area described within this application shall meet any additional requirements of the County, regional agencies, the State of Florida and the United States of America.

Section 3. The use of land approved by this special permit shall be in place, or a valid building permit shall be in force for construction on such land use within eighteen (18) months of the effective date of this resolution. If such land use is not in place or if a valid permit for the construction of such land use is not in effect, within eighteen (18) months of the effective date of this resolution, this resolution approving such special permit is thereby revoked and of no force and effect.

Section 4. All resolutions in conflict with this resolution are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 5. This resolution shall become effective upon adoption by the Board of County Commissioners.


Re: Request to advertise replacement of maintenance technician

I am requesting approval to advertise for a budgeted position, a maintenance technician for the Landscape and Parks department. The position will become vacant due to an employee leaving for a job opportunity with better pay. Due to the fact my department is currently understaffed the position needs to be filled as soon as possible. Because ball season has begun and the Southside Recreation complex will average two (2) tournaments a month from February 2011 through July 2011, with the fall season to follow. The position requires manual work in landscape and park maintenance on various County properties. The scope of work will include ball fields, roadside parks, boat ramps, playgrounds and any other county facility where maintenance is required. I request that this position be advertised outside and not restricted to in-house.

Re: Recruitment for Vacant Librarian II Position

I would like to begin the recruitment process to fill our newly vacant position of Librarian II. It is vacant due to the promotion of Zulima Martinez to Library Manager III. This is a professional librarian position with a minimum requirement of a Master's Degree in Library Science and two years of library experience, including at least one year at the post-MLS level. I do not see the value of first doing an in-house recruitment with that necessary minimum requirement.

The Library's circulation increased 5% in FY 2009-10 to 313,000 even though we had to reduce open hours at the Main Library from 68 to 59 due to staff layoffs, a 13% decrease in hours. Library users made over 100,000 requests for information and/or assistance. This position is a critical one to the Library as it is responsible for coordinating the reference/information department for the entire library system. The person in this position not only provides daily public service in assisting library patrons to find needed information at the Reference/Information desk at the Main Library, but also coordinates all reference/informational programs and collections for the three Library locations. This person is responsible for the Library's eGovernment services, trains staff in effectively using online and print databases and resources, and selects reference materials for the collection. It is a front line customer service position.

The Library used to have two Librarian II positions that worked at the Main Library in the Reference Department, but one position was lost due to the layoffs in the 2009-2010 fiscal year. The Reference Department has been working short since and the vacant Librarian II position needs to be filled soon so that service to the public does not continue to be interrupted. The Main Library Reference/Information Desk has to be covered seven days a week and all the hours the Library is open (59 hours). While we use other Library staff to fill in at the Desk, it is extremely important to have the professional Librarian II to provide guidance and assistance to Library patrons.

The review committee shall consist of two (2) Board members. The Chairman of the Board and the liaison Commissioner over the department or function from which the grievance arose shall serve on the committee. In the event that a liaison commissioner has not been appointed, or in the event that the Chairman and the liaison are one in the same; the Chairman shall select a member of the Board at his discretion to serve.

There has been no liaison Commissioner appointed for the Columbia County Fire & Rescue department; therefore, approval of the Chairman’s selection, Commissioner Ronald Williams, is requested.

CHAPTER 25 - GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE

A. GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE

This grievance procedure is established to provide full opportunity to employees to bring to the attention of management, complaints, grievances, or situations that the employee feels need either adjustment or information. It is the intent and desire of the County to adjust complaints or grievances informally and both supervisors and employees are expected to make every effort to resolve problems as they arise. However, it is recognized that there will be grievances which will be resolved only after a complete review. The submission of a grievance by an employee shall in no way adversely affect the employee or his/her employment with the County.

B. CAUSES OF GRIEVANCES

An employee may file a grievance to register a complaint, to solve a problem, to redress an alleged wrong, to request information, to modify or erase any disciplinary measures taken against him/her, such as written instruction and caution, or a suspension from work. Grievances may also be filed to restore alleged loss of rights due to the Personnel Policies and Procedures or written Department Rules and Regulations.

C. UNACCEPTABLE GRIEVANCES

This grievance procedure is for individual employees to solve their own personal problems concerning the Personnel Policies and Procedures or written Departmental Rules and Regulations. Grievances are unacceptable if filed by one employee for another or for groups of employees. In addition, employees may not submit grievances which include any of the County's Administrative Policies.

D. PROCESSING A GRIEVANCE

In order to assure every employee of a method in which they can get their particular grievance considered rapidly, fairly, and without reprisal, the following steps are provided:

1. The aggrieved employee shall, within five (5) working days of the incident, submit his/her complaint or grievance in writing to the immediate supervisor who may call higher level supervision in an effort to achieve a prompt satisfactory adjustment. The immediate supervisor will make a decision and notify the employee in writing within two (2) working days after having received the complaint or grievance and discussing it with the employee.

CHAPTER 25 - GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE (Continued)

2. If the aggrieved employee feels that the matter has not been settled or adjusted to his/her satisfaction by his/her immediate supervisor, he/she may submit the matter in writing to the department head within three (3) working days after the answer from number one (1) was given. The department head will schedule a meeting within five (5) working days after receipt of the grievance with the employee. If the matter is not resolved at this meeting, the department head shall give a written answer within three (3) working days after the scheduled meeting.
3. If the grievance is not resolved to the employee's satisfaction by the decision of his/her department head, the employee may through the County Coordinator appeal to the Board within three (3) working days after receiving the written findings of the department head. The County Coordinator shall schedule a meeting with the concerned employee and the Board within thirty (30) working days who shall render a decision in writing within five (5) working days.
 - a. If the grievance reaches this step, the Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners may elect to appoint a review committee prior to the grievance being heard by the full board. The review committee shall consist of two (2) Board members. The Chairman of the Board and the liaison Commissioner over the department or function from which the grievance arose shall serve on the committee. In the event that a liaison Commissioner has not been appointed or in the event that the Chairman and the liaison are one in the same; the Chairman shall select a member of the Board at his discretion to serve.
4. Decision of the Board in this grievance procedure shall be final and binding on the parties.

E. GENERAL PROVISIONS OF THE GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE

1. The time limits of this grievance procedure may be extended by management due to illness, vacation, business trips or some emergency. If an extension of time is required, the employee will be notified.
2. Under this grievance procedure, the employee and management have the opportunity to call a witness at the D.2 level and thereafter for each step to the next higher level in the grievance procedure.
3. Any grievance shall be considered settled at the completion of any level, unless it is appealed within the time limits set forth. It is hoped that the great majority of grievances will be satisfactorily settled in the first or second level.

SUBJECT: Subdivision Maintenance

As a follow-up to our meeting this date, I submit the following:

I request that the Board of County Commissioners approve the amending of Article 5, Section 5.7 of Columbia County's Land Development Regulations to read as follows:

Nothing in these land development regulations shall be construed as meaning that the Board of County Commissioners shall take over for maintenance any road, street, utilities, public parking or other public area, or drainage facility related thereto unless:

1. The subject subdivision has a minimum of 50% lot build out.
2. A letter from the developer is submitted to the Board of County Commissioners requesting the County accept maintenance.
3. Upon receipt of such letter the Director of Public Works will perform an inspection of the project.
4. A letter noting any/all discrepancies will be sent to the developer.
5. Developer will notify the Director of Public Works when all discrepancies have been rectified.
6. Director of Public Works will perform re-inspection. If all discrepancies have been corrected, recommendation for final acceptance of maintenance by the County will be submitted to the Board of County Commissioners for their final approval.
7. For subdivisions completed prior to 2011, #1 does not apply.

I understand that the 50% build-out rule will not apply prior to this date therefore, I included the verbiage listed as #7.

Work Site Agreement**

The undersigned agency certifies, attests, and affirms that the agency is a designated tax-supported or tax exempt entity as certified by the Internal Revenue Service and if required, licensed by appropriate governmental entities and/or registered with the Office of the Secretary of State. The undersigned agency certifies that the following terms have been agreed upon in order to utilize offenders under the supervision of the Florida Department of Corrections to perform public service work imposed by the sentencing or releasing authority.

A work schedule will be arranged for the offender that is agreeable with him/her and the agency. The schedule can only be altered with permission of the Department of Corrections or the public service agency supervisor. The public service agency agrees to report offenders who fail to comply (excessive tardiness and/or failure to show for work) with the established schedule or work assignment(s).

The offender will be supervised in the performance of his/her duties. Periodic reports will be provided for the Department of Corrections and the court as to the number of hours completed and the overall work performance of the offender. (See attachment)

It is understood that the Circuit Administrator will investigate any complaints regarding this agreement and may revoke or terminate the agreement unilaterally at any time for cause.

It is understood that pursuant to section 948.036 Florida Statutes, offenders who are under the supervision of the Department of Corrections pursuant to section 948.01, Florida Statutes and who are injured during the performance of court ordered public service work are covered by workers' compensation as state employees to the extent of medical treatment for personal injury.

The undersigned representatives accept the provisions of this agreement.
