WHEREAS, National Correctional Officers and Employees Week raises the awareness of the duties, hazards, and sacrifices made by the Correctional Workers; and

WHEREAS, National Correctional Officers and Employees week in Columbia County, Florida, recognizes employees of the Columbia County Detention Facility, Columbia Correctional Institution, Lake City Youthful Offender Facility for their role in safeguarding the citizens of Columbia County, Florida by providing safe, secure, and humane incarceration of offenders within their custody;

PROCLAMATION NUMBER 2014P-4

100TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE COOPERATIVE EXTENSION SERVICE

WHEREAS, in 1862 President Lincoln signed the Morrill Act, also known as the "Land Grant Act", donating to states tens of thousands of acres of public land to sell and invest the proceeds in an endowment fund that would provide support for colleges of Agriculture and Mechanical Arts, known as land-grant universities; and

WHEREAS, Florida's land-grant universities, which were established under the Morrill Act, consist of the University of Florida (UF) and Florida A&M University (FAMU); and

WHEREAS, 100 years ago on May 8, 1914, the Smith-Lever Act was signed into law and established the Cooperative Extension Service, a partnership between federal, state, and county governments to connect the research and information gathered by land-grant universities with the general public through educational programs; and

WHEREAS, Cooperative Extension is a critical component of the land-grant university mission and works collaboratively with research and academic programs in 106 colleges and universities, including historically black, Native American and Hispanic-serving institutions; in all 50 states, the District of Columbia and six U.S. territories to reach traditional and under-served audiences in all communities; and

WHEREAS, at the University of Florida, Extension is located in the Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences (IFAS), along with the College of Agricultural and Life Sciences (CALS) and the Florida Agricultural Experiment Station, and is called UF/IFAS Extension; and

WHEREAS, Cooperative Extension's research-based education for farmers and ranchers helped establish the State of Florida and the United States as a leading agricultural-producing state and nation in the world; and

WHEREAS, Cooperative Extension translates science-based research for practical application through local and online learning networks where educators are uniquely available to identify emerging research questions, connect with land-grant university faculty to find answers, and encourage application of findings to improve economic and social conditions; and

WHEREAS, the Florida Cooperative Extension Service educates the public on issues such as sustainable agriculture, profitability of animal and plant production systems, competitiveness in world markets, natural resource conservation, energy conservation, disaster preparedness, food safety, child and family development, consumer credit counseling, and youth development.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED that the Columbia County Board of County Commissioners do hereby recognize the 100th anniversary of the Cooperative Extension Service and encourage continued collaboration and cooperation among federal, state, and local governments to ensure Cooperative Extension's sustainability to help people, businesses, and communities to solve problems, develop skills, and build a better future.



RE: Real Terrace Road Extension – 12.41 Acre T.D. Bank Parcel

As you are aware, the Board of County Commissioners in their regular meeting of April 17, 2014 approved a \$50,000 deposit on the above referenced parcel. An Agreement to Purchase was executed. The agreement provided for a 30 day inspection period. The inspection period will end May 3, 2014.

As of this date, the following due diligence items have been completed:

1.) Two (2) appraisals have been completed:

a.) Candler Appraisal Services, Inc.

\$541.000

b.) Hale and Brannon Appraisals

\$650,000

(prior appraised values included T.D. Bank, \$650,000 and the Columbia County Property Appraiser, \$525,929)

2.) A copy of the Environmental Assessment (Phase I) prepared by Enercon Services, Inc. for T.D. Bank has been received. The Assessment is dated May 28, 2012. Enercon recommended that no additional assessment work was warranted. A copy of the Assessment has been provided to Darabi and Associates for review and verification. No changes to the recommendation are expected.

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
3.) A boundary survey of the property is in progress. The survey is necessary to obtain a "clean" title policy. This work is expected to be completed prior to the May 1, 2014 Board meeting.

The parcel is priced to the county at \$515,000. With credit for the deposit, the balance owed is \$465,000. In addition to the balance owed, due diligence expenses are estimated at \$15,000; therefore, a budget amendment (attached) of \$480,000 is requested.


