Staff needs to correct the account and address the overcharge The County has calculated the overcharge as. \$53,412. Staff can provide a credit on the account or issue a refund. Due to the size of the adjustment, this requires Board approval. Staff recommend a onetime refund payment to Budget King for \$53,412. MOTION by Commissioner Hollingsworth to a onetime refund payment to Burger King for \$53,412. SECOND by Commissioner Murphy. The motion carried unanimously.
